Dear friends,

When I was little, my parents took me to a Baptist Church. Lent was a big part of the church year, and I was aware very early on that it was a special time, but I also remember longing for it to end and get the easter eggs. Now, I really appreciate the opportunity Lent gives us to think, to reflect on our faith.

Those of us who are observing Lent will be around halfway through now. I wonder how it's going. Are you feeling the benefits of giving something up, or perhaps taking on something new. Or do the stresses and distractions of life keep getting in the way. Maybe, some days, it's a real struggle to keep going; the commitment seems too much. It's easy, then, to start feeling disheartened and give up altogether.

It may be helpful then to remember that we don't go through Lent alone. We go with each other and with Jesus, who spent those 40 days in the wilderness alone. On those days when Lent almost seems like a challenge too far, we can know deep inside ourselves that we can depend on God's provision and we can learn to face our trials by depending on God's strength, not our own. These forty days give us time to seek God, to learn to trust in him more, to walk in his way.

He can give us the strength we need. Dietrich Bonhoeffer once wrote," All the temptations which accompany the working day will be conquered on the basis of the morning breakthrough to God." That's the time we spend offering the day ahead to him and asking him to help us through it.

Words in the letter to the Hebrews are words to hold on to:

"Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need." Amen.


