Dear friends,

What do you do the week after Easter? Over the last few weeks, we've followed Jesus on the journey to the cross. We've welcomed him into Jerusalem waving palm branches, we've been to Gethsemane, wept on Good Friday, and celebrated the third day when he rose again. Do you find yourself thinking, "What next?"

Peter and six others go back to Galilee, to the sea. They may have left Jerusalem, but they can't leave behind their memories. Life with Jesus over the last three years had been emotional demanding. They needed space, time to heal. So they return to a familiar way of life. Fishing was something they knew.

When they see Jesus on the shore, they don't recognise him, not until he tells them to put down their nets again. Peter, characteristically impulsive, leaps out of the boat to get to Jesus. Jesus cooks breakfast for them, and they share in the meal together,

At the end of the meal, Jesus takes Simon aside and asks him, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Deep within his being, did he truly love Jesus? It's a question that Jesus asks us too, one that each of us must answer for ourselves.

However we feel we can answer at this point in time, we have a God who meets us where we are and as we are in Jesus. He knows our weakness and accepts us as we are with all our faults and mistakes, forgives us, and moves us forward.

Peter was sent forward with a commission. "Feed my sheep," says Jesus. Jesus challenged Peter to follow him, to live out his faith, sharing the gospel. His love for Jesus was to be shown in reaching out to people. Jesus calls us, too, just as we are, to "Feed his lambs," to love, to care, to serve. If we truly love Jesus, it will work itself out in ministry - to his people and to his world.

Jesus says to each of us, "Do you love me?" and then comes the challenge "Feed my sheep."

So, what next for you?

Good Shepherd of the sheep, by whom the lost are sought and guided into the fold; feed us and we shall be satisfied; heal us and we shall be made whole; and lead us, that we may be with you; for you are alive and reign, with the Father and the Holy spirit, One God, now and forever. Amen

On this Sunday the lectionary readings suggested concentrate on the good shepherd (Psalm 23 and John Ch $10\ v\ 11\ -18$)

In John Ch 10 v 14 -15, it says: -

I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me – just as the Father knows me and I know the Father – and I lay down my life for the sheep.

Reassuring words for us all at this time

Quotes to Ponder

- God writes the gospel, not in the Bible alone, but on trees and flowers and clouds and stars (Martin Luther 1483 1546)
- Find your purpose and fling your life out into it (Phillips Brooks 1835 1893 an American Clergyman and author)
- The Book to read is not the one that thinks for you, but the one which makes you think. No book in the world equals the Bible for that. (James McCosh 1811 – 1894)

James McCosh was a Scottish philosopher, born in Ayrshire who went to live in America in 1868 and became president of Princeton University. He was the first American religious leader who endorsed that the evolution of the species (put forward by Charles Darwin) could lie 'hand in hand' with religion.

200 Years ago

After all the lovely Easter eggs and chocolates we have enjoyed at this time, it is an important anniversary – Cadburys is 200 years old!

In 1824, John Cadbury opened a grocer's shop in Bull Street, Birmingham where he sold cocoa and drinking chocolate which he prepared himself. They became very popular and in 1831 he bought a warehouse nearby and started manufacturing. His sons

continued the business and in 1878 they moved to a new site, south of Birmingham which they called Bournville. They built a town full of green spaces, where the employees could live, work and play – with tennis courts, bowling greens, swimming pools – unheard of for ordinary people in those Victorian days. This was the first 'garden city' in the UK. Here are some Key dates

1875 The first chocolate Easter Egg

1905 Cadbury Dairy Milk bar

1915 Milk Tray Chocolates

1920 The Chocolate flake

1938 Roses chocolate – named after the English packaging equipment company. 'Rose Brothers' that manufactured and supplied the machines that wrapped the chocolates.

1971 The Crème egg

What are your favourites?

In 1935, the Cadbury Foundation, which won a charitable trust was begun. This continues to invest in local communities to help give everyone a better way of life.

Cadburys has more than 10,000 employees in this country and is now part of Mondelez International world Wide.


How many words of 4 letters or more can you make from this? No proper names or foreign words. (there are over 200!)
