Lent

This begins on Ash Wednesday 5th March and ends on Maundy Thursday 17th April 2025.

Here is a collect for the second Sunday

Christ, son of the living God, who for a season laid aside the divine glory and learned obedience through suffering: teach us in all our affliction to raise our eyes to the place of your mercy and to find in you our peace and deliverance. We make our prayer in your name. Amen

During Lent, there will be daily reflections from the Methodist Church with the theme 'Soul Food'. Where every day of the 40days of Lent there will be reflections based on 'In the Wilderness, Jesus reminded us that people do not live by bread alone'.

The weekly themes are 1/ Soul food 2/ Soul shelter 3/ Soul rest 4/ Soul repair 5/ Soul mates 6/ Soul songs. To find out more, go to the methodist church website.

The gospel lectionary reading for the first Sunday in Lent is Luke Ch 4 v 1-13, where we read of Jesus being tempted for 40days. Here are verses from a hymn written by Rev. John Forster on this theme, and related to our temptations

Jesus, we are tempted as we live each day; and we lack your courage, walking on life's way. Help us, Lord Jesus, in the things we do, help us shun temptations as we follow you.

Jesus, may the spirit bring us strength, we pray; to resist the tempter as we live each day.

Teach us your way, Lord, help us battle through; with your light to live by, may we journey too.

(The tune is called 'Noel Nouvelet', a French melody, that we sing to 'Now the green blade rises from the buried grain')

As we journey through lent may we reflect on what the Lord has done and is doing for us each day.

World Day of Prayer Fri 7th March

This is a yearly event when we pray with everyone around the globe. This year the service is written by the people of the Cook Islands (in the South Pacific Ocean, N.E of New Zealand)

The theme for the day is 'I made you wonderful' Let us all join together in prayer on this day.

John Newton 1725 -1807

In the February magazine it was stated that the hymn writer, John Newton was born 300years ago so let us celebrate his life and works this month.

John had an eventful life so much that his life story has been immortalized is several films, plays and books.

At a young age, he worked on slave ships and at the age of 20 became a slave himself in what is now known as Sierra Leonne. He was rescued, but then became Captain of slave ships. Later, in 1748, he experienced a conversion to Christianity whilst on board a ship in stormy, dangerous conditions and renounced the slave trade and became ordained as a church of England minister. John lived to see the British Empire's Abolition of the African slave trade in 1807, just months before he died. He wrote more than 280 hymns, the most famous on being 'Amazing Grace' written in 1772. The words are based on his experience of receiving God's grace and mercy, despite the terrible things he had done in his earlier life.

In the first verse he writes: -

'I once was lost, but now am found, was blind, but now I see!'

In the third verse he writes about how his life would now be. 'The Lord has promised good to me, His word my hope secures; He will my shield and portion be, as long as life endures'

Other hymns we still sing today include;

'How sweet the name of Jesus sounds', 'Begone, unbelief', 'Glorious things of thee are spoken'

In 'How sweet' he praises the Lord for his changed life

'Jesus, my shepherd, brother, friend,

My prophet, priest and King.

My Lord, my life, my way, my end,

Accept the praise I bring'

Poetic words so relevant to our life in Christ today. John Newton was born when John Wesley was 22 years and he was acquainted with, and influenced by John Welsey and George Whitefield.
