- God didn't promise days without pain, laughter without sorrow, sun without rain, but He did promise strength for the day, comfort for the tears and light for the way.
- Wise men still seek Him.

In the Methodist Prayer Handbook for 2023/2024, Day 19 is the day when we are asked to pray for our district of Manchester and Stockport, together with praying for Christians in Asia.

The prayer for this day, from long ago, is written by Lucy Herbert (1669-1744).

Let us be yours, O God. Let us not draw back from you, neither from your presence, nor from your cross. Touch our hearts and make them holy. Consecrate our lives and enlist them in your service. Amen.

Lucy Herbert was an English aristocrat who left Britain to join a priory in Bruges, Belgium. She took vows in the monastic community and became prioress. In her time, the convent increased in members under the leadership. There is a portrait of her in the Scottish National Portrait Gallery in Edinburgh and a portrait of her in Powys Castle in Wales.

80 Years Old

Methodist Homes for the Aged (MHA) is 80 this year. It began in 1943 when the Rev. Walter Hall and members of the Methodist church founded MHA. These founders wanted to improve the quality of life of older people in a time before we had a welfare state or NHS. Today, MHA provides care, accommodation and support for 19,000 older people across the UK, with 6,500 employees, 3000+ volunteers and there are over 100 chaplains representing 10 different denominations and faith groups.

Their Motto is: - Live later life well

Here are some comments from people you have helped.

'I go on dementia friendly day trips. We are off to the theatre next week. I had stopped doing things like that as they just felt too stressful, but since joining MHA, those things are possible'

'Before finding MHA, I was depressed, lonely and only went shopping once a week; now I am out all the time. I love being a member'
