

Social Inclusion and Participation of Immigrants Through Media Literacy

The Erasmus+ project, "Social Inclusion and Participation of Immigrants Through Media Literacy," embodies the European Union's dedication to promoting "Inclusion and Diversity." This initiative, conducted in partnership with PLUS - Austrian Institute for International Research and Development and the Türkiye Research Foundation (TAV), focuses on empowering economically and socially disadvantaged youth, especially those from migrant backgrounds in Türkiye and Austria, by providing them with the skills and opportunities to thrive in the media sector.

Project Overview

The aim of this project is to enhance media literacy among immigrant youth, enabling them to critically engage with media content and become informed consumers and creators of media. By equipping young immigrants with the knowledge and tools to navigate the digital media landscape, we empower them to produce news, express their unique perspectives, and participate actively in public discourse. The project also fosters research initiatives and collaboration between disadvantaged youth and media professionals, journalists, and academic institutions. Ultimately, this initiative seeks to develop policy recommendations to ensure media inclusivity and to provide accessible, free media and communications courses.

Vienna Phase (July 17 - 22, 2024)

The five-day Vienna phase of the project promises an immersive and enriching experience for all participants. Set against the backdrop of Austria's vibrant capital, this segment offers intensive training sessions, cultural excursions, and invaluable networking opportunities.

Participants will engage in comprehensive workshops aimed at enhancing their media literacy skills. These sessions will cover various aspects of media consumption, digital storytelling, and journalism. Led by expert trainers and media professionals, the workshops ensure high-quality, hands-on training.

Excursions and Cultural Activities

Participants will explore historical landmarks, museums, and cultural sites, fostering a deeper understanding of Austrian culture and history. These excursions are not only educational but also promote cross-cultural understanding and appreciation.
