


Beverly Vanterpool Set to Launch Empowering Career Guide, "Build Your Table," at BVI LitFest

Road Town, British Virgin Islands – November 5, 2025 — Accomplished business leader and diversity advocate Beverly Vanterpool will launch her inspiring new career guide, Build Your Table: Find Career Clarity, Make Bold Pivots, and Thrive—Even When the System Isn't Built for You, at the BVI LitFest, hosted by H. Lavity Stoutt Community College on Wednesday, November 5th.

Part memoir, part practical guide, Build Your Table shares Beverly's journey from a shy Caribbean teenager to a senior director at global corporations in London. Drawing on two decades working in the UK for companies including Accenture, Hewlett Packard,

American Express, and Visa, Beverly offers unfiltered insight into the challenges—and the possibilities—of building a thriving career as a woman, immigrant, and professional of colour navigating systems not initially designed to include them.

"This is the guidance I wish I had at the start of my career," says Beverly. "My hope is that anyone who has felt like an outsider—especially introverts, women, people of colour and immigrants—will find real tools, inspiration, and practical strategies to create their own opportunities and thrive on their own terms."

The book addresses:

- Overcoming obstacles as a woman of colour in corporate life
- Building professional networks, and the value of sponsors and role models
- Making bold career pivots and handling transitions
- Managing redundancy and personal reinvention
- Embracing leadership, resilience, and personal growth in the face of systemic barriers

Throughout, Beverly combines personal storytelling with practical exercises to help readers reflect, strategize, and take action—no matter where they are in their journey.
