February Demo - Joanne Nelson - Mixed Media



Jo Ann Nelson is an Acrylic - Mixed Medium Artist, who is always looking for an object or form in nature that will stimulate the creative process. She relies heavily on an emotional attachment to that source as a topic to create a body of work. The use of many different materials and techniques are used to create truth as she sees it. An archival end-product is a necessity. She intentionally depicts the contours of an object, with shapes and swirls of color and texture to create an essence rather than a likeness. Capturing emotions of a special memory and transforming them to be observed and felt by the viewer is the main purpose for a piece of art. With each piece, the idea is to create a bridge allowing the flow of information between the artwork and the individual. Her desire is to challenge and stimulate others to see more tomorrow than they see today.

- o The city of Westminster shot a promotional video of the gallery, which was posted on the city's Facebook page last week, with a lengthy description of Paletteers involvement, our talented artists exhibiting in the gallery and our hours. We have it posted on our Paletteers Facebook page. Several people in the community have come in after seeing it. December was a great success with 12 paintings sold and we had 10 participating artists. This month we have 14 people participating and we sold 2 paintings so far in the first week. Exhibits will rotate every month and ideally, we will need 16 people to participate each month, so we only need to work one 5-hour shift or 2 split shifts each month. White outside lights aren't working so Tom put a call into the City for a repair.
