

Health

Key Programs

Maternal waiting home

The Maternal Waiting Home Program aims to improve standards in health and livelihood for underprivileged pregnant mothers from remote rural communities who need Goroka Hospital services to give birth safely. Providing a conducive healthy environment for a pregnant mother is a fundamental human right of critical importance to health, wellbeing and economic prosperity. It is a human rights for a mother to be pregnant and delivery her baby in a safe and healthy environment.


Many mothers in remote areas cannot go for supervised delivery and access family planning services at the Goroka Provincial Hospital. When women are referred from very remote areas, they are worried about food where they will cook and they come with their relatives, the hospital cannot cater for them to stay for two to three months and that were the maternal waiting home comes in, which we have built really assisted the marginalized pregnant mothers of Eastern Highlands Province and PNG as a whole.

This year we partnered with the Australian based NGOs and individuals who have assisted in kind and monetary value to meet the operational cost for the organization and as well as items needed by the pregnant mothers at the waiting home. Some of partner organizations we partnered with are; Peoples of Australasia Innovative and Growth Abroad (PAIGA), Days for Girls Australia, Australian Aid through Australian Volunteers Program (AVP) and individual donations (Sue Moorhead & Elliot Croucher).

Thank you Seng Da Trading Ltd for your generous donation to the Waniati Maternal Waiting Home. Companies like you are vital to the continued success of our mission to the project from extinction, and we are grateful for your support. Thank you again for your dedication to help ease the situation and for helping us prevent Maternal and Infant Mortality Rate in Eastern Highlands Province and PNG as a whole.

We've partnered with Digicel PNG Foundation and through its Community Grants Program, two important health facilities were funded and was constructed at the maternal waiting home in Goroka. The WASH facilities was funded through the Foundation's Community Grants Program. We are so thrilled to partner with existing and new partners to assist high risk and underprivileged women to deliver their babies safely.

Assisted two hundred and ninety-one high risk and marginalized pregnant women deliver their babies safely at Goroka Provincial Hospital.


. Below is the number of new born babies born safely at the Goroka Provincial Hospital.

At the moment, with high cost of living and the prices of goods and services increasing, purchasing store food (rice & tinned fish), toiletries, maternal packs, baby bundles, vehicle service parts which the organization couldn't meet as our budget prohibits regular purchases of these items at the maternal waiting home.



We're thinking of whining down our maternal waiting home program but fortunately PAIGA came on board and provides funding assistance which rescue the organization to meet concurrent and other related costs.

It was a high time but PAIGA acted swiftly and many marginalized pregnant mothers would go for supervised delivery and access family planning services at Goroka Provincial Hospital.



It's a tradition and culture for the Seventh Day Adventist (SDA) church to pays visits to hospitals, prisons, widows and orphans in the communities through the Adventist Community Services (ACS) Program.

The Wando SDA church in Goroka and Unggai/Bena district have donated store & garden foods, firewood, toiletries, maternal packs and baby bundles for the pregnant women cared for at the waiting home.



Digicel Company and its philanthropic arm, the Digicel PNG Foundation aims to make great impact on communities where the company do business. Digicel branch here in Goroka donated baby bundles to pregnant mothers at the waiting home.

It is one of the company's obligation to give it back to the communities under its Corporate Social Responsibility of the organization.

The Digicel Company and its philanthropic arm, the Digicel PNG Foundation are working collaboratively with Waniati Maternal Waiting Home to assist high risk and underprivileged women deliver their babies safely.



The Waniati Maternal Waiting Home in Goroka received a donation of food stuff, maternal packs, baby bundles and toiletries worth K2, 000.00 from **SENG DA Trading Ltd.** The waiting home has been facing financial problems in providing balanced nutritious meals and essential items needed at the labour ward.

The Managing Director from SENG DA Trading Ltd presented the items as a means of support to the pregnant women. The maternal waiting home facility provided an essential service because it is operated like a hospital and open every day to attend to pregnant mothers. Pregnant women who were the full time residents at the waiting home. They eat, take shower, receive medication and need around clock supervision and checks while waiting for labour. These pregnant have a lot of need.

SENG DA Trading Ltd has come on board to support this worthy cause under its Corporate Social Responsibility where it does business activities. The Executive Director of Waniati Maternal Waiting Home was thankful for the donation, adding the contribution towards supporting their programmes at the waiting home.

We had also written to the Government for support but had not received a feedback yet. It's such a good gesture from SENG DA Trading Ltd at such a critical time where the price of goods and services are sky rocketing.

Water and Sanitation Hygiene (WaSH)

Water supply & Septic toilet

WASH is a fundamental human right of critical importance to health, wellbeing and economic prosperity. Unsafe drinking water, lack of sanitation and poor hygiene practices directly contribute to the transmission of preventable diseases, including neglected tropical diseases, diarrhea, cholera, dysentery and typhoid.



The WaSH facility project was successfully delivered and maintained on the time frame and within budget. The project outcome was delivered as expected.

The under privileged pregnant mothers will no longer use pit toilet but access to the septic toilet and water hand basin installed in the ablution block. Pregnant mothers and sick patients can fetch water at the maternal waiting home rather than travelling distance to fetch water from creeks.

Director and founder Victor Timothy honored handing over scissor to Guest of Honour Ms. Serena Sasingian, CEO Digicel Foundation to officially open WASH facilities at the waiting home.

Menstrual Hygiene Awareness

In Papua New Guinea society, it's a taboo and culture for the men folks to keep distance away from pregnant mothers during childbirth period and even when it comes to talk about Menstrual Hygiene no one wants to discuss.




Days for Girls Australia donated 150 Kit washable maternity pads to pregnant women accommodated and cared for at the waiting home. The total value of donation to the waiting home is approximately K8, 300.00.

"The pregnant women were so happy (to receive 150 reusable Menstrual Kits and) send their greetings and love to the DfGA. One of the pregnant mothers said the reusable Menstrual Kits has been of great help to the pregnant women to use after giving birth at Goroka Hospital. Menstrual pads are very expensive for a rural pregnant mother to buy and I use old clothes, towels, and traditional materials such as moss and leaves are utilized". "Most pregnant women can go for supervised delivery at the Goroka hospital which can now help in reducing maternal and infant mortality rate in Eastern Highlands Province and PNG as a whole due to availability of Reusable Menstrual kits at the waiting home." a pregnant mother said.

The Waniati Maternal Waiting Home is very pleased to have signed a new 3-year MOU for collaboration on the distribution of DfGA Washable Menstrual Health Kits to our marginalized pregnant mothers who are accommodated and cared for at the waiting home in Goroka, Papua New Guinea.

With this new MOU in place, we'd even have more kits to distribute to pregnant women, and we would love your assistance to raise funds to deliver these kits to the underprivileged pregnant women in remote areas in Eastern Highlands Province.

Maternal and Child Healthcare

Postnatal Integrated Day Clinic

It's very vital that postnatal mothers and their new born babies are educated well on the postnatal and neonatal danger signs to avoid maternal and infant mortality rate. Most rural mothers are not informed about all these danger signs after giving birth to their child.

The postnatal integrated day clinic was established within the maternal waiting home facility purposely to educate and examine mothers and their neonates to ensure that both are well and in good health before discharging them from waiting home and going back to their remote villages.



eNurse is an Australian based company has offered sphygmomanometer kit and Sue Moorhead a good friend who resides in Toowoomba, Queensland in Australia has donated medical equipment to Waniati Postnatal Integrated Day Clinic. And also Elliot Croucher is another Australian guy who has contributed to meet the administration costs and paving way for the parcel containing medical equipment to reach the Waniati Postnatal Integrated Day Clinic.




3.1 Below is the number of pregnant mothers who have visited ANC Waniati Postnatal Integrated Day Clinic:

Seven hundred and eighty-nine pregnant mothers attended ANC clinic.


3.2 Below is the number of people who have access Family Planning Services- New Acceptors at Waniati Postnatal Integrated Day Clinic:

Four hundred and forty-nine people access family planning services.


3.3 Below is the number of people who have undergone testing for HIV & STIs at Waniati Postnatal Integrated Day Clinic:
