Roof Project Update

We have recently received inquiries from members concerning the status of the roof project and what are our plans going forward. We first want to give you a little history about our roof and how it all came about.

In 2018 we found we had leaks in the roof on the north entrance tower and we also had some issues on the chapel roof. At that time temporary repairs were made to the chapel roof and we had permanent repairs made to the tower roof.

In April of 2019 the Council started looking into our options for a permanent repair to the Chapel and Education wing roof. One suggestion was to investigate the installation of a peaked roof. Just as this got started, COVID happened and we all went into shutdown. At the 2022 Annual Meeting the issue was discussed briefly again and we moved orward, getting bids.

One bid was obtained for a peaked roof for \$110,000 and another bid for flat roof repairs of \$90,000. We started fundraising and with generous donations from our congregation and a generous matching donation of \$40,000 we currently have \$84,524 designated funds for the roof. Thank you to all who have contributed.

Currently we are not having any issues with the roof over the Chapel and Education wing of the building. We do know that the 30-year-old roof will need replacing in the future, however, based on the current stability of the roof, we are hoping to get a few more years out of the roof and that hte price of materials will stabilize. At today's prices we know that our old estimastes are low and we will have to budget accordingly. We continue to investigate the option of a peaked roof, which will require an engineering study, or a flat roof. Please know that as we get closer to a decision on when to replace the roof, peaked or flat, we will include you, the member of Immanuel, with that information.


IMMANUEL LUTHERAN ENDOWMENT FUND
