What Information I Collect

I may collect:

- **Session notes** brief, factual notes to support your counselling.
- Administrative data appointment details and payment records (no payment card data is stored).

Why I Collect Your Data

I collect and process personal data so I can:

- Communicate with you effectively.
- Arrange and manage appointments.
- Provide counselling safely and ethically.
- Keep clinical records (as recommended by professional bodies).
- Comply with legal and professional obligations.

The lawful bases for this include **contract**, **legitimate interest**, **consent**, and **legal obligation**.

How Your Data Is Stored

I take steps to protect your privacy:

- Paper records (if used) are securely locked away.
- **Digital notes** are stored on encrypted, password-protected systems.
- Access to your data is limited to me unless disclosure is legally required or agreed with you.

I keep client records for **7 years** after our final session, after which they are securely destroyed.

Confidentiality & Sharing

What you share is confidential. I will not share your personal data unless:

- You give your **explicit consent**.
- There is a **serious risk of harm** to yourself or others.
- I am required to by **law** (e.g. court order).
- I discuss your case anonymously with a clinical **supervisor**, to ensure safe and ethical practice. This is always done without using any identifying details.

Your Rights

- Complain to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO)
