Step 1 – Choose the Right Month

You're coming to Rhodes.

Now you need to **decide when**.

This one choice affects everything:

How hot it feels

How crowded it is

How much you pay

How enjoyable your days are

Most first-time visitors default to July or August because “summer = summer”.

Many regret it.

Local reality:

April – May → Green island, mild heat, perfect for exploring

June → Warm, lively, great balance

July – August → Very hot, very busy, highest prices

September → One of the best months overall

October → Calm, golden light, still great for swimming

There is no “best” month for everyone.

There is only the right month for your travel style.

Step 2 – Where to Stay in Rhodes

This is the decision that shapes your entire trip.

Most travellers choose a hotel first and only later realise they chose the wrong area.

They end up:

Discovering the sandy beaches are on the other side of the island

Far from what they wanted to see

Dependent on taxis or a car they didn't plan for

In a resort that doesn't match their travel style

Rhodes is not one destination.

It's many different areas with very different vibes.

Choosing the right area matters more than choosing the "perfect" hotel.

You'll suddenly see clearly:

- Whether you actually need a car
- How long day trips will take
- Which beaches and towns are realistic
- How relaxed or rushed your days will feel

Your location quietly decides the rhythm of your holiday.

That's why the smart way to plan Rhodes is always: **Area first**. Hotel second.

Get the location right, and everything else – transport, day trips, pace, and comfort – falls into place naturally.

Once your base is clear, the next practical question becomes obvious:

Step 3 – How to Get Around Rhodes

How you move around the island will shape what you can realistically see and how relaxed your days feel.

Most travellers ask the wrong question:

“Should I rent a car?”

The better question is:

“How much freedom do I actually want on this trip?”

For most 7-day Rhodes holidays, the sweet spot is simple:

Rent a car for **1–2 days**. It lets you reach villages, viewpoints, and hidden beaches without needing a car all week.

In Rhodes you have three main options:

 Buses – Cheap, reliable on main routes, perfect if you stay in the right area

 Taxis – Convenient for short trips and evenings

 Car Rental – Best for full freedom, villages, and hidden beaches

The mistake most people make is choosing transport before choosing their base.

If you stay in the right area, you may not need a car at all.

If you stay in the wrong one, a car becomes a necessity.

Step 4 – What to Book First

Once you know when you're coming, where you'll stay, and how you'll move, planning suddenly becomes simple.

The mistake most travellers make is booking things in the wrong order.

They book:

Random tours
Last-minute hotels
Expensive transport
...before the basics are settled.

The smart order is:

 Flights
 Accommodation
 Transport/Transfers (if needed)
 Experiences

Get the foundations right first – everything else becomes cheaper and easier.

You don't need to book everything. Pick one or two that match your style, leave space for beaches, wandering, and spontaneous moments.

That's where Rhodes feels most magical.

Next comes something most guides avoid talking about:

The mistakes and tourist traps locals see every day.



Step 6 – Tourist Traps & Local Warnings

Rhodes is beautiful – but a few local traps can turn a great day into an expensive one.

Old Town Restaurant Traps

In busy Old Town spots (often near fountains and squares) you'll see places that:

Show no menu or prices

Use loud "inviters"

Charge extreme amounts (yes – even €80 for a BOOT of beer)

Spot them by: no menu, no prices, staff blocking your path and inviting in aggressively.

In my [Full Rhodes Travel Guide](#), I share all the local warnings, habits, and small details that visitors usually only learn after something goes wrong – so you can move around the island with confidence instead of trial and error.

Bracelet Scam

Near Mandraki Port and in narrow streets, "friendly" women may place a "free" bracelet on your wrist – then ask for money. Don't engage. Don't take it. Just keep walking.

Parking Tip (Saves Money)

With a rental car, never park under trees or shady rural spots – especially near Tsambika Area. Goats climb onto cars to rest, causing scratches and damage.

Park in open areas and under the sun, even if you walk a little more. – Trust me :)

Car Break-Ins at Popular Spots

At very busy places like Anthony Quinn Bay, Kallithea Area, rental cars can be targets for quick break-ins.

Local rule:

- Never leave bags, backpacks, or valuables visible
- Don't hide things under seats – thieves know the tricks
- Take everything with you, even for a "2-minute stop"

These break-ins are rare, but they do happen – and almost always to cars with something visible inside.

Step 6 – What to See & Do in Rhodes

BEFORE YOU BOOK – Quick Essentials

These small details remove most “arrival stress” before it even starts.

Passport & Entry

Greece is in the Schengen Zone. Make sure your passport is valid for your entire stay (and beyond, if required by your country).

Money & Daily Costs

Greece uses the Euro. Cards work almost everywhere, but keep some cash for small tavernas, buses, and beach spots. Paying in cash may result getting better prices.

Typical eating-out costs in Rhodes:

Coffee: €2–4

Gyros / street food: €4–6

Casual taverna meal: €12–18 per person

Nice dinner with wine: €20–30 per person

Tipping

Not mandatory. Locals usually round up or leave a few euros.

In restaurants, around 10% is considered generous, not expected.

Power Plugs

Standard EU plug (Type C/F). Bring an adapter if needed.

Mobile Data

EU travellers roam for free. Non-EU travellers should consider an eSIM before arrival – airport options are expensive.

Tourist Tax (Paid at the Hotel)

Greece charges a nightly Climate Resilience Fee, paid directly at your accommodation. It is per room, per night and usually not included in online prices.

For the main season (April–October), expect:

- 5★ hotels & villas → €15 / night
- 4★ hotels → €10 / night
- 3★ hotels → €5 / night
- 1–2★ hotels → €2 / night
- Apartments & similar stays → €2 / night

This is normal, official, and collected at check-in or check-out.

Add it to your budget so there are no surprises on arrival.



RHODES MAP LOGIC – See the Island Like a Local

Rhodes isn't one destination.

It's a long island with very different "zones", each offering a completely different holiday. Once you understand this, planning becomes simple.

The North – Energy & City Life

Rhodes Town and its surroundings

Windier, lively, full of restaurants, history, nightlife, and transport links.

Best for: culture lovers, walkers, short stays, car-free trips.

The East Coast – Beaches & Resorts

Faliraki, Kolymbia, Lindos area

Calmer sea, sandy beaches, easy swimming, classic holiday feel.

Best for: beach lovers, families, relaxed trips.

The South – Wild & Quiet

Open landscapes, Prasonisi, long empty beaches

More nature, fewer people, big skies.

Best for: explorers, surfers, slow travel.

The Island's Hearts

- Rhodes Old Town – Medieval centre and cultural core
- Lindos – White village with dramatic Acropolis views

Where you stay places you inside one of these worlds.

That's why you should always plan Rhodes as:

Area first. Hotel second.
