ADULTS



Bring the following:

- Clothing
- Emergency contact information
- Phone and other devices
 - Chargers
- Personal care items
- Eyeglasses
- List of health conditions
- Medications for seven days
- Hearing aid and extra batteries
- Batteries for assistive devices



CHILDREN

Caretakers should bring:

- Clothing
- Diapers
- Formula
- Comfort items
- Books, games, puzzles, etc.
- List of health conditions
- Medications for seven days
- List of medications
- Doctor and emergency contact information

Children should:

- Know the first and last names of their parent(s) or guardian(s)
- Always be accompanied by an adult



PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

You should bring:

- Doctor and emergency contact information
- List of health conditions
- Medications for seven days

You may need:

- Batteries or chargers for assistive devices
- Medication delivery device
- Special feeding supplies
- Manuals or instructions for any electricity and battery dependent assistive technology/medical devices

Don't forget your:

- Cane, walker, rollator
- Wheelchair or scooter
