



Publish your research on PortailCoop and get a 20% discount on your registration fees!

Researchers who have never published or who do not have all their publications on [PortailCoop](#), the world's largest digital library on cooperatives, can contribute to this knowledge commons by and for the cooperative movement, other researchers and practitioners. In recognition of this contribution, they are eligible to receive a 20% discount on either the early bird or the regular registration fees for the ICA CCR 2025 Conference.

Researchers must either:

- Submit at least 5 of their publications that are not on PortailCoop, or
- Submit all their publications (if they have less than 5) *.

Instructions for submissions to PortailCoop

Before submitting your content:

- You must [create an account](#) on PortailCoop.
- Then go to the [content submission page](#).
- At the beginning of the submission process, you will be redirected to a form that will assist you in providing the necessary metadata and uploading the files.

If your content is open access and under CC BY 4.0 license or you sign/grant PortailCoop of HEC Montréal a dissemination license by checking the "License of use" box authorizing PortailCoop to archive, publish, produce, and reproduce your content, it will be available in full text in PortailCoop.

If your document has been published by a publisher and you do not own the copyright, a link to the resource on your publisher's page will be provided in the document's record.

Some publishers allow self-archiving but require that the published source be cited and/or that a link is made to the published version of the document on the publisher's site. This information, as well as any other information required to meet your publisher's copyright disclosure requirements or relevant to your submission can be added in the "Description" field of the form (see screen capture below).

Accepted content

A wide variety of content types, without limitation on the nature of the documents (text, audio, video) or file formats, can be submitted:

- Article
- Thesis
- Interview
- Conference proceedings (published document, not just a presentation)
- Book
- Book chapter
- Podcast
- Case study
- Research report

The discount **does not apply** if the publications are already in PortailCoop, since the aim is to enrich the digital library.

Which version to submit?

Although you may not own the copyright to your scientific articles, various versions can be submitted:

Version of the article	Availability on PortailCoop	Example
Preprint: Non-peer-reviewed version of your scientific article	The document will be available on PortailCoop with the mention that it is the preprint version of the article	Data cooperatives as catalysts for collaboration, data sharing, and the (trans)formation of the digital commons
Postprint: Peer-reviewed version of your scientific article accepted by a journal, but not formatted by the journal	The document will be available on PortailCoop with the mention that it is the postprint version of the article	Embedding circularity: Theorizing the social economy, its potential, and its challenges
Final version: Version of your scientific article published in a journal <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Open access under CC BY 4.0 license: Final version of your article freely accessible online for everyone • Restricted access: Final version of your article accessible online on the publisher's website. A license, university/institution affiliation or payment is required to access the content on the publisher's website 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The document will be available on PortailCoop • The document will NOT be available to ALL PortailCoop users, but only to those who have access to the publisher's website 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Circular economy and cooperatives: An exploratory survey • Management in worker cooperatives: Democracy vs. dissonance and possible overcoming approaches

After submitting your content

- Once the PortailCoop librarian has reviewed and accepted your content, you will receive a discount code by email to use for your registration. Please note that the review process may take up to two weeks depending on the volume of requests received.
