The back nine of the Champion Course at PGA National Resort in Palm Beach Gardens is renowned for hosting the Honda Classic and featuring "The Bear Trap" (holes 15, 16, and 17), a challenging three-hole stretch designed by Jack Nicklaus. This demanding finishing sequence features water on all three holes, requiring high-level precision.

**Key Features of the Champion Back Nine:**

**The Bear Trap (15-17):** Considered one of the toughest stretches on the PGA Tour, these holes are characterized by tight, water-guarded approaches.

**Hole 15:** A par 3, 179 yards, with a treacherous green surrounded by water and bunkers.

**Hole 16:** A 434-yard par 4 that demands a precise approach to a narrow green.

**Hole 17:** A 175-yard par 3, often played directly into the wind, requiring a precise shot over water.

**Hole 18:** A 556-yard, challenging par 5 finishing hole to conclude the round.

The back nine of the Champion Course is famously known for its high difficulty, with the water hazards and wind playing a major role in the outcome of professional tournaments.

Perched on a narrow peninsula off the coast of Ireland, Old Head Golf Links is pure golf adrenaline. Cliffs plunging 300 feet straight into the Atlantic, tee shots that feel like they're hanging over the ocean, and views so wild you'll forget you're indoors—until you stripe one down the middle.

I figured it was time to play a course from our own lovely state of Wisconsin and travel to Sand Valley. We’re going to play the front 9 and the course holds a 3/5 difficulty rating on the Trackman. Click this [link](#) if you’d like to watch a quick overview of the course.

Brief write up from Trackman on the course:

- Bill Coore and Ben Crenshaw routed Sand Valley over high dunes and through dramatic valleys and meadows. Amid the scrub oaks, pines and blueberry bushes, they created a variety of holes and strategies. Sand Valley is an elegant and classic course that is challenging, entertaining, and fun. The layout captivates discerning golfers and has from its opening motivated golfers to travel to the Central Sands of Wisconsin for a timeless expression of the game.

**Scioto Country Club:** Where legends begin

**Columbus, Ohio**

**Difficulty: 3/5**



This is the most old-school venue on this list, but don't let that fool you. Scioto hosted the third edition of the Ryder Cup back in 1931 and helped shape the future of American golf. The Golden Bear himself learned the game here, and the Donald Ross design — restored to his original specifications in 2021 — remains a masterclass in subtle strategy.

Give Scioto a go and you'll see how understated can still mean demanding. The par-5 8th winds around a stream toward a well-defended green, while the uphill 9th par-3 is all about holding your nerve.

It's not the longest or flashiest track, but it's one of the most quietly brilliant — and a bona fide piece of Ryder Cup history.

Tiger's highly anticipated mountain course stretches along Jordanelle Ridge with sweeping views of the Uinta Mountains, Deer Valley ski runs, and the Jordanelle

Reservoir. Still under construction, the par-72 layout is set to top 8,000 yards from the tips, with holes flowing between exposed ridgelines and sheltered valleys.

In VG3, you'll get the full panorama — ridge-top tee shots, tightly mown surrounds that demand creativity, and elevation shifts that make club selection interesting. Go for the back tees if you want to see just how far “high country” golf can go.
