- 1. Science (or Natural Philosophy) consists of demonstrable knowledge, not just options. It is truth based on facts.
- 2. Man has a connection to the natural world around him. It's not a passive relationship, but one where we have the responsibility to actively 'tend' it, not merely to dominate it.
- 3. At the basic science level, students should classify, examine, enjoy, and work with the common arts. This helps develop a grasp of an "objective and ordered reality."
- 4. The Laws of Nature demonstrate God's covenant with his creation and reflect His rightful control.
- 5. Scientific discussion is good, but opinions should not be given without supporting proof.
- 6. All elements of learning can be connected with Science.

7. Scientific narratives (stories) are excellent inspirations!

8. Never lose your sense of wonder and imagination.
