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01 -- SURVIVAL ENGLISH

Survival English

الانجليزية الاساسية للمواقف اليومية في العمل

These phrases keep you functional in any English-speaking professional environment. Study them until they are

automatic. They cover misunderstandings, overload, disagreements, buying time, and creating records.

-- CLARIFYING + CONFIRMING --

"Could you say that again? I want to make sure I get it right."

هل يمكنك إعادة ذلك؟ أريد أن أتأكد من فهمي الصحيح.

Asking for repetition without seeming lost

SURVIVAL

ZOOM

"Let me make sure I understand -- you're saying that...?"

دعني أتأكد من فهمي -- تقصد أن...؟

Confirming understanding before acting on it

SURVIVAL

"Just to confirm -- we agreed on X, and I'll deliver Y by Z. Correct?"

للتأكيد فقط -- اتفقنا على X وسأسلم Y بحلول Z. صحيح؟

End of any agreement -- creates a written record

SURVIVAL

EMAIL

"I want to make sure we're aligned before I proceed."

أريد التأكد من اتفاقنا قبل المضي قدماً.

Protects you from "that's not what I asked for"

FREELANCE

"I think we might be talking past each other -- let me reframe."

Defusing miscommunication before it escalates

"Could you give me an example of what you mean?"

When abstract instructions are unclear

SURVIVAL

-- BUYING TIME WITHOUT LOOKING UNPREPARED --

"I'll circle back on this -- give me a moment to look into it."

سأعود إلى هذا -- أعطني لحظة للنظر فيه.

Buying time without saying "I don't know"

SURVIVAL

EMAIL

"That's a good question -- let me think on it and get back to you."

هذا سؤال جيد -- دعني أفكر فيه وأعود إليك.

Stalls gracefully in a live conversation

"I don't have that number off the top of my head -- I'll confirm and follow up."

Not knowing a fact without damaging credibility

SURVIVAL

"Let me park that and come back to it -- I want to give it the attention it deserves."

*Deferring a complex topic without dismissing
it*

**"I'll need a little more context before I can
give you a useful answer."**

Asking for more info before committing

**"I want to give you an accurate answer
rather than a fast one."**

Signals care over speed -- strong professional framing

SURVIVAL

-- MANAGING WORKLOAD + CAPACITY --

**"Happy to take that on -- what's the timeline
and priority level?"**

يسعدني تولي ذلك -- ما هو الإطار الزمني ومستوى
الأولوية؟

Accepting a task while setting clear expectations

SURVIVAL

**"I'm slightly over capacity right now -- can
we revisit this next week?"**

طاقتي الحالية ممتلئة قليلاً الآن -- هل يمكننا مراجعة هذا
الأسبوع القادم؟

Saying "I'm overloaded" without complaining

SURVIVAL

"I want to flag something before it becomes a problem."

أريد الإشارة إلى شيء قبل أن يصبح مشكلة.

Early warning -- always better than late surprise

SURVIVAL

ZOOM

"If I take this on, something else will have to move -- can we decide together what gets deprioritised?"

إذا تولّيت هذا، فسيتعين نقل شيء آخر -- هل يمكننا تحديد ما يتم تأجيله معاً؟

Pushes workload decisions back to the manager

SURVIVAL

-- DISAGREEING WITHOUT DAMAGING THE RELATIONSHIP --

"I want to push back on this a little -- hear me out."

أريد الاعتراض على هذا قليلاً -- استمع إليّ.

Disagreeing confidently without being aggressive

SURVIVAL

ZOOM

"That is a fair point -- and I'd like to add another angle."

هذه نقطة وجيهة -- وأودّ إضافة زاوية أخرى.

Acknowledges their point before redirecting

SURVIVAL

"I see it differently -- can I share why?"

أرى الأمر بشكل مختلف -- هل يمكنني مشاركة السبب؟

Frames disagreement as a question -- disarms defensiveness

SURVIVAL

"I'm not sure that's the right direction -- here's my concern."

لست متأكداً أن هذا هو الاتجاه الصحيح -- هذا هو قلقي.

Leads with concern not accusation

SURVIVAL

ZOOM

"That's an interesting way to frame it -- can I offer a different perspective?"

Universal softener -- works everywhere, every time

SURVIVAL

DEFENSIVE

"I hear you -- and I still have some reservations I'd like to voice."

أسمعك -- ولا يزال لدي بعض التحفظات التي أودّ التعبير عنها.

Acknowledges without surrendering

SURVIVAL

-- CREATING RECORDS + CLOSING CONVERSATIONS --

"Just to recap what we agreed on -- I'll send this over as a written summary."

فقط لأستعرض ما اتفقنا عليه -- سأرسل هذا كملخص مكتوب.

End of meeting -- creates a paper trail automatically

"I'll send a quick summary of what we discussed and the action items."

سأرسل ملخصاً سريعاً لما ناقشناه وبنود العمل.

Habit that builds trust faster than anything else

SURVIVAL

EMAIL

"I'll need written confirmation before I move forward."

سأحتاج إلى تأكيد كتابي قبل المضي قدماً.

Never proceed on verbal alone -- non-negotiable

SURVIVAL

FREELANCE

"Could we schedule some time to go over this together?"

هل يمكننا تحديد وقت لمراجعة هذا معاً؟

Requesting a meeting without sounding demanding

SURVIVAL

EMAIL

-- ASKING FOR HELP + FEEDBACK --

"I'd love your input on this before I finalise."

أودّ الحصول على رأيك قبل أن أنهى هذا.

Inviting feedback -- builds trust with collaborators

SURVIVAL

EMAIL

"Can I get your honest take on this?"

هل يمكنني الحصول على رأيك الصريح في هذا؟

"Honest" signals you actually want real feedback

SURVIVAL

"I may have missed something -- can you point me to it?"

ربما فاتني شيء -- هل يمكنك توجيهي إليه؟

Admitting a gap gracefully -- shows self-awareness

SURVIVAL

"I want to be upfront about something that might be a concern."

أريد أن أكون صريحاً بشأن شيء قد يكون مصدر قلق.

Opening a difficult conversation honestly

SURVIVAL

FREELANCE

"Any feedback on this would genuinely help me improve."

أي ملاحظات على هذا ستساعدني حقاً على التحسن.

Asking for critique in a way people want to give

SURVIVAL

DISCORD

"Is there anything I could have done better here?"

هل هناك أي شيء كان يمكنني فعله بشكل أفضل هنا؟

Post-project reflection -- builds long-term relationships

SURVIVAL

FREELANCE

-- WORKPLACE SMALL TALK (OFTEN UNDERESTIMATED) --

"How's your week looking?"

كيف يبدو أسبوعك؟

The simplest, most natural opener for any call

SURVIVAL

ZOOM

"I'll let you get back to it -- thanks for your time."

سأتركك تعود لعملك -- شكراً على وقتك.

Closing a conversation respectfully

SURVIVAL

ZOOM

"Likewise -- really enjoyed this conversation."

وأنا كذلك -- استمتعت حقاً بهذه المحادثة.

Warm exit -- leaves a good final impression

SURVIVAL

"Looking forward to working together on this."

أتطلع للعمل معاً على هذا.

Natural enthusiasm signal at the start of a project

SURVIVAL

02 -- DEFENSIVE ENGLISH

Defensive English

الانجليزية الدفاعية -- المقابلات والضغط والهجمات اللفظية

Each card shows the attack, trap, or pressure question -- and the exact counter-move. The goal is to absorb, reframe, and redirect. Study both sides of every card.

-- BIAS + LOCATION ATTACKS --

Attack: "Your English doesn't seem strong enough for this role."

هجوم: "يبدو أن انجليزيتك ليست قوية بما يكفي لهذه الوظيفة."

Counter: "I appreciate the directness. I communicate clearly in writing, I'm a strong async collaborator, and my results speak for themselves -- would you like to see examples?"

Turns language bias into a portfolio opening

INTERVIEW

Attack: "We have never hired anyone from Gaza before."

هجوم: "لم نوظف أحداً من غزة من قبل."

Counter: "That means I get to set the standard. I'm fully remote-ready, have delivered across time zones, and I'm the kind of hire that raises the bar for everyone who follows."

Reframes "first time" as an advantage, not a risk

INTERVIEW

Attack: "Are you even reachable given the situation there?"

هجوم: "هل أنت قابل للوصول في ظل الأوضاع هناك؟"

Counter: "I've been delivering client work consistently under genuine pressure for [X period]. My track record shows I don't miss deadlines -- I can send you references who will confirm that."

Responds with evidence, not emotion

INTERVIEW

Attack: "Can you work our timezone?" (passive exclusion)

إقصاء ضمني: "هل يمكنك العمل في توقيتنا الزمني؟"

Counter: "I have a 4-hour overlap with EST and a proven async track record. Many of the best remote teams run intentionally async -- do you already have distributed team members?"

Normalises async, flips the question back

INTERVIEW

ZOOM

-- EXPERIENCE + SENIORITY CHALLENGES --

Attack: "We were expecting someone more senior."

هجوم: "كنا نتوقع شخصاً أكثر خبرة."

Counter: "I understand. What specifically were you looking for? I want to either address it directly -- or be honest with you about whether this is the right fit."

Forces them to name the gap -- you control the next move

INTERVIEW

Attack: "Your background has some gaps."

هجوم: "يوجد بعض الفجوات في خلفيتك المهنية."

Counter: "Those gaps were periods of intense self-directed learning and project work. Let me show you what I built during that time -- it is more relevant to this role than what is on paper."

Reframes absence as hidden action

INTERVIEW

Attack: "Why should we take a chance on you?"

هجوم: "لماذا يجب أن نخاطر بتوظيفك؟"

Counter: "Because I don't come to work to be comfortable -- I come to solve problems. Here is a specific example of a hard problem I have solved that your team is likely facing right now..."

Pivots immediately to proof, not defensiveness

INTERVIEW

Attack: "This is a very demanding role -- are you sure you can handle it?"

هجوم: "هذا الدور صعب جداً -- هل أنت متأكد أنك قادر عليه؟"

Counter: "I have been operating under genuine pressure for years. Demanding is where I do my best work. What specifically concerns you -- let's address it directly."

Shows composure under the attack itself

INTERVIEW

-- RATE + VALUE CHALLENGES --

Attack: "Your rate is too high for someone at your level."

هجوم: "معدلك مرتفع جداً مقارنة بمستواك."

Counter: "My rate reflects my output, not my years of experience. Let me walk you through what I have delivered and what it was worth to previous clients -- then you judge."

Shifts frame from seniority to ROI

INTERVIEW

FREELANCE

Attack: "We have many strong candidates -- what makes you different?"

ضغط: "لدينا كثير من المرشحين الأقوياء -- ما الذي يميزك؟"

Counter: "I don't know your other candidates. I know that I understand this role, I have solved this exact problem before, and I will be here at 11pm if the project needs it."

Sidesteps comparison, anchors to reliability

INTERVIEW

-- CLASSIC INTERVIEW TRAPS --

Trap: "Where do you see yourself in 5 years?"

فخ: "أين ترى نفسك بعد 5 سنوات؟"

Counter: "Doing excellent work I am proud of, with a team that takes quality seriously. Titles matter less to me"

than impact. What does growth actually look like for this role?"

Refuses the trap, redirects to their answer

INTERVIEW

Trap: "What is your biggest weakness?"

فخ: "ما هو أكبر نقاط ضعفك؟"

Counter: "I tend to over-prepare -- it is hard for me to submit work I'm not satisfied with. I've learned to balance that with deadlines, but my standards stay high."

Turns a weakness into a disguised strength

INTERVIEW

Trap: "Tell me about a time you failed."

ضغط: "أخبرني عن مرة فشلت فيها."

Counter: "Once I underestimated a project scope and missed a deadline by three days. I owned it immediately, communicated early, and rebuilt the client's trust. They re-hired me the next month."

Shows accountability + recovery -- the only good answer

INTERVIEW

Trap: "How do you handle conflict with a colleague?"

فخ: "كيف تتعامل مع الخلاف مع زميل؟"

Counter: "I address it directly and early -- not passive aggressively and not in a group setting. I name the issue, ask for their view, and look for the outcome that serves the project."

Shows maturity, not conflict avoidance

INTERVIEW

Trap: "Tell me about yourself."

فخ: "أخبرني عن نفسك." (معظم الناس يسردون سيرتهم الذاتية)

Counter: "I solve [X type of problem] for [Y type of organisation]. Most recently I [specific result]. I'm here because this role seems like the exact type of challenge I do best."

Problem-solver framing -- not a biography

INTERVIEW

Trap: "Why do you want to work here?"

فخ: "لماذا تريد العمل هنا؟"

Counter: "Because of [specific thing you actually researched -- a project, a product decision, a public statement by the team]. That told me this team thinks carefully about [X], which is rare."

Specificity signals you are genuinely interested

INTERVIEW

Trap: "What is your current salary?"

فخ: "ما هو راتبك الحالي؟"

Counter: "I'd rather focus on the value I bring to this role than anchor to past numbers. What is the budgeted range for this position?"

Refuses the anchor, redirects to their budget

INTERVIEW

Trap: "Do you have any questions for us?"

فرصة: "هل لديك أي أسئلة لنا؟"

Best questions: "What does success look like in this role at 90 days?" / "What is the biggest challenge the team is facing right now?" / "Why is this role open?"

Your questions reveal your thinking -- make them count

INTERVIEW

"I want to make sure I'm answering the right question -- is this what you're really asking?"

أريد التأكد من أنني أجيب على السؤال الصحيح -- هل هذا ما تقصده فعلاً؟

Use when: A question feels like a trick or contains a hidden assumption. Forces them to show their hand before you answer.

Exposes the real question behind any trap

DEFENSIVE

"I appreciate you raising that -- let me address it directly."

أقدر طرحك لهذا -- دعني أتناوله مباشرة.

Use when: A concern or criticism lands mid-interview. Shows confidence and maturity rather than defensiveness or panic.

Neutralises hostility before you respond

DEFENSIVE

SURVIVAL

"Before I answer -- can I ask what's driving that question?"

قبل أن أجيب -- هل يمكنني أن أسأل ما الذي يدفع هذا السؤال؟

Use when: A question seems loaded or unfair. Understanding the concern lets you answer what they actually need to hear.

The single most powerful defensive phrase

DEFENSIVE

INTERVIEW

"I don't have a perfect answer -- but here is how I would approach finding one."

ليس لديّ إجابة مثالية على ذلك -- لكن هذه هي طريقتي في إيجادها.

Use when: You genuinely do not know the answer.
Shows thinking process over knowledge -- which senior interviewers want to see.

Honesty + structured thinking beats bluffing every time

INTERVIEW

03 -- NETWORKING + OUTREACH

Networking + Outreach

Every professional relationship starts with a single sentence. These phrases open doors without desperation, add value before asking, and close conversations without awkwardness.

-- OPENING A CONVERSATION (WARM OUTREACH) --

"I saw your comment on X -- that's exactly the problem I've been thinking about."

رأيت تعليقك على X -- هذا تماماً المشكلة التي كنت أفكر فيها.

Best cold opener ever -- specific is memorable

"I've been following your work for a while -- the X project really stood out."

Shows you did research -- instantly separates you

Leading with value -- the most
underrated strategy

minutes? Async is totally fine."**

"Async is fine" removes timezone friction instantly

Direct but dignified availability signal

Closes any pitch gracefully -- removes all obligation

"Dropping this here in case it helps -- no ask attached."

Community goodwill -- the most underrated strategy

Engaging discussions to build visibility organically

Leading with pure value before any personal ask

Positioning yourself as a resource before a seller

"Feel free to check out my portfolio -- built it specifically to show [X type of work]."

تفضل بالاطلاع على معرض أعمالي -- بنيت خصيصاً لإظهار [نوع X من العمل].

Sharing work without sounding like you're selling

DISCORD

REDDIT

"Any feedback on this would be gold -- I'm specifically trying to improve X."

أي ملاحظات على هذا ستكون ذهباً -- أحاول تحديداً تحسين X.

Asking for critique -- specific ask gets specific answers

DISCORD

REDDIT

-- LOCATION + REMOTE IDENTITY --

"I'm based in Gaza -- fully remote, GMT+3, and I have delivered for clients in 6 countries."

أقيم في غزة -- عمل عن بعد بالكامل، GMT+3، وقد عملت مع عملاء في 6 دول.

Own your location -- turn geography into a proof point

"Remote-first is how I do my best work -- I have years of evidence to back that up."

Frames remote as a feature, not a compromise

Pre-empting timezone concerns professionally

Reframes adversity as proof of quality

Second follow-up -- removes guilt from non-response

Final graceful exit that keeps the door open

Value-based follow-up -- never just "checking in"

04 -- FREELANCE CLIENT MANAGEMENT

Freelance Clients

إدارة العملاء المستقلين -- الاستقطاب والحفاظ والحماية

Freelancing is a business, not a job application. These phrases help you close clients, set rates, handle scope creep, deliver bad news professionally, protect your boundaries, and exit gracefully.

-- SCOPING + QUOTING --

"Before I give you a number, I'd like to understand the full scope -- can you walk me through it?"

قبل أن أقدم رقماً، أودّ فهم النطاق الكامل -- هل يمكنك توضيحه لي؟

Never quote until you fully understand the job

FREELANCE

"My rate for this scope is X. I can adjust deliverables to fit your budget -- what matters most to you?"

معدلي لهذا النطاق هو X. يمكنني تعديل المخرجات لتناسب ميزانيتك -- ما الأهم بالنسبة لك؟

Anchors rate while staying flexible -- adjust scope, not rate

FREELANCE

"Happy to start with a small paid test project -- that way we both see how we work together."

يسعدني البدء بمشروع اختباري مدفوع صغير -- حتى نرى كلانا كيف نعمل معاً.

Low-risk entry for hesitant new clients

FREELANCE

"I'll put together a brief scope of work for us to agree on before I start."

سأعد ملخصاً موجزاً للنطاق لنوافق عليه قبل البدء.

Always document scope. Always.

FREELANCE

"I don't negotiate my rate -- but I can adjust what's included at this price."

لا أتفاوض على معدلي -- لكن يمكنني تعديل ما هو مضمّن بهذا السعر.

The only rate negotiation you should ever accept

FREELANCE

"I'll need a 50% deposit before I begin -- this is standard across all my projects."

أطلب دفعة 50% مقدماً قبل البدء -- هذا معتاد في جميع مشاريعي.

Non-negotiable -- say it once, confidently, and move on

FREELANCE

-- HANDLING SCOPE CREEP + BOUNDARY PROTECTION --

"That falls outside the original scope -- I'm happy to add it for an additional fee."

هذا خارج النطاق الأصلي -- يسعدني إضافته مقابل رسوم إضافية.

The only correct answer to scope creep -- polite and firm

FREELANCE

"That sounds like a new project -- want me to put together a quick quote?"

يبدو هذا مشروعاً جديداً -- هل تريد مني تقديم عرض سريع؟

Reframes scope creep as a new opportunity

FREELANCE

"I've delivered what we agreed. Additional revisions beyond this would be billed separately."

سلمت ما اتفقنا عليه. المراجعات الإضافية بعد هذا ستحتاج فاتورة منفصلة.

Firm boundary on unlimited revision requests
