

WHAT IS IRSC?

The International Relations Scholastic Conclave is an annual symposium of scholarly and intellectual discourse organized by the Department of International Relations, Jadavpur University.

This conclave intends to present an Interdisciplinary and inclusive discussion on various pressing issues related to the global state of affairs. For this purpose, we intend to organize

various events ranging from paper presentations to panel discussions and academic simulations.

The Faculty, the Research Scholars and the students at the Department of International Relations shall be working together for the Departmental conclave to come to fruition.

Every year, to facilitate the discourse we pick a theme of global or political importance. This year, the 3-day academic conclave will be based on the theme,

"Looking through the Lens of the Global South"

We intend to explore this vast theme from an interdisciplinary approach and look into the lives of the people, through the lens of gender, sexuality and the subaltern; understand the political-economy of the global south; and delve into the implications of the political and technological development in the Global South.

 Multiple event participation is allowed as long as there are no overlapping schedules.

 All participants must present a valid government-issued ID (such as Aadhaar or voter ID) for identity verification.
 Additionally, they must provide a valid school or college ID to confirm their current year of study.


 Participants are expected to maintain civil behaviour and decorum throughout the event.

REGISTRATION

- Registration is mandatory before the submission of the abstract.
- Open to undergraduates, postgraduates, and research scholars of all disciplines.
- Undergraduates register as Juniors; postgraduates and research scholars as Seniors—non-compliance results in cancellation.
- For teams, only one member registers on behalf of the team.

TOPIC

Participants have to choose any one topic from their respective categories

JUNIOR Category:

- Roadmap for creating social and economic infrastructure to ensure Right to Food
- Roadmap for the development of public education institutions to ensure Right to Education

SENIOR Category:

- Roadmap for Sustainable development of the agricultural sector of developing countries
- Roadmap for the development of the public healthcare institutions to ensure Right to Healthcare

- This is an offline event to be held on 29th April 2025
- Each team must comprise a minimum two and a maximum three members.
- · The event will be conducted in English
- If selected, the participant will be notified via email by 15th April.
 Only qualified students will present the final paper, to be submitted by 20th April.
- Finalists are required to pay a fee of Rs 150 (undergraduate students), Rs 200 (postgraduate), and Rs 350 (research scholars). Co-authors are charged separately.
- The final paper should be between 1500-2000 words with a font size of 12 in Times New Roman.
- All members of the team have to be present for the final presentation, failing which the team will get disqualified. Such communication of absence must be informed to the organisers prior to the event.
- All final presentations will be held on the same day, irrespective of the categories
- Any further rules will be explained by the heads of the event on that day.

TOPICS

Participants have to choose any one topic from their respective categories:

JUNIOR Category:

- Weaponisation of Sanctions: Global South and Economic Sovereignty.
- Faces of Racism: Immigrant Communities in the West.

SENIOR Category:

- Brahminism, Resistance and Caste Annihilation: Releasing Agricultural Growth and Development in India.
- The Politics of 'Drags': Towards Redefining Gender and Sexuality.
- Rise of AI and Platform Capitalism.

REGISTRATION

- Registration for the event is mandatory before the submission of the abstract.
- Open to those currently enrolled in or having completed high school (equivalent to +2 level) and beyond, regardless of their discipline.
- Individuals and teams may participate. Only one team member registers on behalf of the team
- Participants reaching the final round are required to pay a fee of Rs 150 for undergraduate students, Rs 200 for postgraduate students, and Rs 350 for research scholars. Co-authors will be charged separately.

- Each team may have multiple co-authors, but only 2 can present.
- The abstract must be mailed for the prelims round.
 Those who will qualify will present in the final round: offline for Kolkata participants, and online for participants residing outside of Kolkata.
- Participants have the option to present in either English or Bengali
- Proper references and citations are mandatory (APA style) for the final paper.
- Plagiarism in any form is strictly prohibited.
- Both team members have to be present for the final presentation, failing which the team will be disqualified. Such communications of absence must be informed to the organizers prior to the event.

Participants have to choose any one topic from their respective categories

JUNIOR Category:

- Rise of Religious Fundamentalism in Contemporary South and South-East Asia.
- Rethinking Governance in the Age of Al.

SENIOR Category:

- Corporatisation, Displacement and the Adivasi Voice: A More Sustainable Approach towards Development.
- Neo-Fascism and Challenges of Journalism in Contemporary South and South-east Asia.
- Capitalism and Body Dysmorphia.

REGISTRATION

- Open to individuals currently enrolled in or having completed high school (equivalent to +2 level) and beyond, regardless of their discipline.
- High school and undergraduate students register for the Junior Category. Postgraduate students and those with higher qualifications register for the Senior Category; non-compliance results in cancellation.
- Registration fees: Rs 100 (individual).

- The event will be bilingual: Essays will be accepted in English or Bengali.
- Participants must write an essay on any of the given topics.
- One participant can only submit one essay. Multiple submissions will lead to disqualification.
- The essay should be between 800 and 1500 words.
- Essays must be submitted in PDF or Word format at irsc2025submissions@gmail.com
- Participants must use the APA format for citing references.
- Only original essays will be accepted. Previously published or plagiarised essays will result in disqualification.
- Essays will be assessed on the originality and clarity of content, the quality of analysis and research, and the language and structure of the essay.
- The last date of submission is 15th April 2025.

ARGUMENTIS

REGISTRATION

- Open to high school (+2), undergraduate, and postgraduate students of all disciplines.
- Individuals and teams (max. 2 members) may participate.
 Only one team member registers on behalf of the team
- Registration fees: Rs 100 (individual) and Rs 200 (team of two)

TOPIC

- The topic will be disclosed to the participants 24 hours prior to the commencement of the event
- The teammates can choose the stances on their own



- The event will be held offline on 29th April
- The debate follows the Oxford format.
- Participants may debate in either English, Bengali or Hindi. Their language choice must be declared beforehand and maintained throughout the event
- 10 teams will qualify for the finale.
- For prelims, the time limit shall be 3+1 (3 mins speaking time followed by 1 min of rebuttal)
- For finals the time limit shall be 4+1 (4 mins speaking time followed by 1 minute of rebuttal)
- Participants must adhere to the time limit.
- Participants will be individually assessed, but strong team-spirit is valued.
- Using unparliamentary language, abusive words, or inappropriate gestures leads to immediate disqualification.
- Judges' and coordinators' decisions are final.

- The rankers' posters will be featured in the official Instagram handle of IRSC'25.


