Why a Mobile App?

A mobile app offers several advantages over other means of communicating with members such as websites, social media, Lodge bulletins, and email blasts. Unlike websites which are static and require users to search for information, a mobile app is dynamic and delivers content straight to members through the use of notifications, calendars, and more. Apps also take advantage of the user's phone features and allow members to use functions such as a Lodge locator based on their location. Further, the mobile app does not require users to maintain a social media profile on platforms like Facebook or Twitter to receive information updates. Instead, the app is designed to provide information directly to members to increase engagement and participation in your Lodge.

Mobile apps are not just for younger members. Research has shown that across all age demographics the majority of people are using smartphones with 61% of those over the age of 65 and 83% of those age 50-64. Further, app usage for those 65 and over averages over 50 hours per month. Consequently, members across all age and geographic demographics use and benefit from apps like the My Elks Mobile App. Thus, making this a truly versatile tool for you to engage with your membership regardless of where your Lodge is located or the average age of your membership.

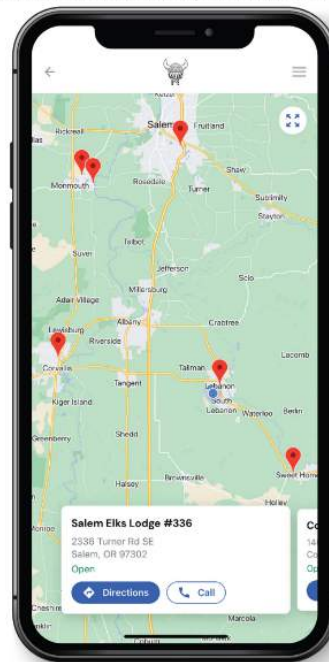
The current app combines elements of the Grand Lodge website, State Association websites, Lodge websites, Lodge social media, and the Lodge bulletin into one easy to use platform for members. For example, when members travel, the app can be their guide to Elks Lodges across the country. With a GPS enabled Lodge Locator, the app also identifies Lodges within 50,000 meters of their current location. Members can also use the app to get directions to a Lodge they want to visit, view Lodge events, dinner menus, and other information. Ultimately, this app has been built not just to provide easy access and use information but to also provide Lodges with a tool to increase their participation, engage members, build on retention efforts, and ultimately increase revenues and membership in your Lodge.

Then on August 3, 1949, congress approved the nationwide observance, and President Harry Truman, himself a member of the BPOE, signed the holiday into law.

Each year Grand Lodge calls on us to celebrate Flag Day with a community gathering. This year we had the honor of the Clackamas Fire Department, First Responders, and the Milwaukie Police Department joining us for our Flag Day ceremony. Eagle Scout Flag Ceremony

A flag flown over our nation's capital was presented to new Eagle Scout Logan Lim from Troop 64. The presentation was done by Emma Pletz at Moreland Presbyterian Church. Logan's Eagle project involved the removal of decayed railroad tie steps, replacing them with pressure-treated lumber, and upgrading the existing trail to the steps in Hoyt Arboretum. Also attending the ceremony were ER Mike Cronk and Leading Knight Lysie Winstead.



Scholarships

The Most Valuable Student contest has now opened for high school seniors! This award is open to any high school senior and you do not need to be affiliated with the Elks in order to apply. The application can be found at enf.elks.org/MVS. The deadline for applications to be submitted online is November 14. The application will be judged at the lodge level first where the first-place boy and girl will receive \$1,000 each, the second-place boy and girl \$500 each. The top three boys and girls will then advance to the District level where more money can be received for the top three boy and girl winners. Those winners at the District level then advance to the state level where additional funding can be awarded. The top 17 students statewide will advance to the National contest where the minimum award is \$4,000 over four years. Be sure to let all high school seniors know of this great opportunity.

There is also a \$4000 Legacy Award for college-bound high school seniors who are children or grandchildren of dues-paying Elks. You can visit enf.elks.org/leg for full eligibility details. The application is available online starting September 1 with a deadline of February 6, 2023.

For anyone wanting to pursue a vocational trade, there is the Oregon Vocational Grant. There are no age requirements for this \$2000 grant, but the student must be going into a vocational trade and the grant may not be used as a stepping-stone to a 4-year degree. This can be used by those who are already in a vocational trade and wanting to upgrade their skills or for someone wanting to start from scratch. Examples of a vocational trade would be construction, plumbing, welding, beauticians, coding, bicycle repair, firefighting, EMT, the list is endless. The application can be found at Oregonelks.org under Student contests/scholarships. The deadline for online submission for this grant is March 1, 2023.
