The linings in all Cairns Service Helmets except No. 5 Leather are demountable. If replacement of a lining becomes necessary it can be easily removed by anyone. In the case of the Aluminum Helmets it can be snapped out with the fingers. In the Leather Helmets the groove in the retaining band has to be slightly opened by the point of a small screw driver.

HELMET SIZES

Because of our large production we are equipped for making our helmets in all sizes up to 7% (over-size 24½ or more in circumference on special order at extra charge.) We not only produce all sizes, but each size may be had in three shapes; that is, "regular," "long," or "round." This is a feature



of the utmost importance in a hat or helmet of rigid construction. In ordering for heads of irregular shape, mention size and shape, for example: 7½ "long." If exact size is not known, give circumference taken with a tape, being sure to take the measurement low down around the large part of the head — see sketch.

HOW TO FIGURE PRICES ON HELMETS

All Prices are F.O.B. New York

Prices given below the illustrations are for BLACK HELMETS with Regular Lettered Fronts. The dozen price applies on orders of 6 or more.

No extra charge is made for white fronts on Officer's Helmets, unless the insignia are shown. See page 12 for extra charges for fronts made with insignia.

Red or White Helmets are 25c each extra.

If fronts are not wanted allowance is 50c per Helmet, except on Numbers 351A, 418, and 430 — allowance is 25c.

Any Helmet illustrated with the head piece may be made without the head; allowance if both head and front piece are omitted 65c per Helmet.

REPAIRING

It is our effort at all times to co-operate with our customers to enable them to get the best possible service from their Helmets. With this in view we have established a Repair Department for reconditioning and remodelling both Aluminum and Leather Helmets. Correspondence is solicited from those who are interested in investigating this service.

REFINISHING OUTFIT

You can prolong the life and good appearance of your helmet by occasionally sand-papering rough spots, and giving it a coat of enamel. We will supply a can of our special black enamel, sandpaper and a good brush (enough for 24 helmets) at \$2.50.

NEW LININGS

To insure safety and comfort, Helmets should be kept in good condition with special attention to the linings. On all new models except No. 5 new linings may be installed without sending the Helmet to the factory. Advise how many are wanted and measurement wire with instructions for sizing will be forwarded. When only the rubber cushion needs to be renewed, remove the lining and forward it to the factory; (one day only required to do the work.) (See note page 3 for removing lining.)

"Regulation" Wherever Leather Helmets Are Used

This helmet is made from the best quality of grain leather specially tanned to give toughness. The completed helmet is put through a special hardening process so that it will hold its shape and resist heat. The best of materials, careful workmanship and a final finish of specially prepared paints, combine to produce an article of great durability.

Reinforcement—To prevent shrinkage and warping out of shape, a fault of all ordinary leather helmets, the Cairns Patented Flanged Reinforcement was devised. This consists of a metal band secured to the base of the skull inside the lining and made with a flange extending over the edge of the brim. The edge of the flange is rolled into a groove forming a retainer for the lining and providing for its easy removal. Metal plates straddle the base of the four main combs and are riveted through the base of the skull, binding the brim, the crown and the band securely together.

Lining—Two kinds of lining may be had, plain felt, or the Cushion type. Both styles are shaped so as to distribute the shock of a blow and to prevent the head from being forced into the top of the Helmet (for complete description of the Cushion lining see page 3).

Brim—The brim, made from a single piece of leather, is toughened and embossed under heavy hydraulic pressure and shaped to throw the water to the rear. Its edge is rolled and an endless wire reinforcement stitched therein.



In the Regulation eight-comb type the skulls are made of four quarter sections sewed together, the joint forming the main ribs or combs. In this new Helmet the upper half of the crown is one solid piece. The side is a single piece lapped and joined at the back. Another new feature is the comb which is made of a separate piece of leather securely stitched to the crown, and this comb is reinforced by a steel wire greatly adding to stiffness and strength. This type of Helmet is made in two weights, heavy and medium, of the finest quality materials. In it is used our patented flanged reinforcing band which prevents shrinkage and provides a retainer for the lining. It is made with both plain felt or cushion lining with and without ear laps as ordered. The prices for the two different weights are listed below.





FRONTS FOR HELMETS

Front Plates for the Helmets are an important feature, as they serve not alone to improve the appearance of the helmet, but also as identification of the organization, its branches, and its officers. We can furnish a great variety of designs but show only a few, as these will give a general idea of what is used. Our leather fronts are made of the best patent leather,, neatly cut and stitched. The lettering is set in panels, which are artistically arranged and a combination of colors used to make the names stand out clearly. In most departments all officers use white fronts, usually with insignia of rank. Black fronts are the rule for privates of Engine and Hose Companies, while privates of Truck Companies use a red front. Rescue Squads usually use a blue front for the privates. Fronts with regular lettering as shown just below are supplied with helmets without extra charge. Special fronts with insignia are charged extra as shown by the schedule at the bottom of the page.

TURNOUT OR QUICK HITCH CLOTHING

The Cairns Three-in-One Turnout Coat was designed to meet the various needs of the Fireman which no ordinary garment would fill. It is made up of three thicknesses of material, each serving a separate purpose. The outside is of heavy duck for wearing quality — there is a lining of heavy felt for warmth — and in between the two a waterproof interlining. Actually three coats in one. It is provided with a high collar lined with corduroy, having strap and buckle to close tightly at the throat. Snap and ring fasteners are

provided on the overlapping fly front. The snap and ring fastener has been found the quickest and easiest to operate and the most practical for firemen's garments. The yoke and shoulders are double thick and the arm-pits are reinforced with leather. Two side pockets with snap buttons. It is a durable article and in cold weather nothing will replace it, as it is both warm and waterproof.



CAIRNS & BRO. CELEBRATES 100th ANNIVERSARY

Carefully preserved in the office of Cairns & Brother, now located at Lafayette Street and Astor Place, New York, is a certificate dated 1829, testifying to the fact that Henry T. Gratacap "is one of the firemen of the City of New York." Those were the days of watch towers, leather buckets and hand pumpers, when firemen wore high hats of felt and paper or "leathern caps." The firemen of the New York City Volunteer Department were ordered to wear leather "caps" as early as 1813. The purpose of the cap was to designate their membership in the department, but Mr. Gratacap soon saw the necessity for something that would give protection as well.

In 1836 he set up a small shop at Broadway and Walker Street, New York for the purpose of manufacturing firemen's helmets, and thus founded the business which is now, and has been for many years past, known as Cairns & Brother.

Search of early records indicates that one Jacob Turk made a "leathern fire cap" as early as 1740, but Mr. Gratacap is credited with being the first to make the hardened leather fire helmet with enlarged brim, and also with being the first to decorate the helmet with the brass eagle head, a style which is traditionally known as the American Regulation. The fundamentals of his



design are found in the most popular models of today, though many improvements have since been made. The demand for this helmet grew, soon making larger quarters necessary, and when Mr. Gratacap moved to 143 Grand Street in 1850, his friends freely predicted that to go so far "uptown" would be ruination. On the contrary his business prospered, and in 1869 he sold out to two Cairns brothers, Jasper and Henry. They in turn were succeeded by two more Cairns brothers, Edward and Irving. Irving survives and at 84, is still active in the business. His successor is a son, Edward, and associated with the firm for nearly 50 years is a nephew of Irving, Walter.

The firm name Cairns and Brother remains unchanged and is favorably known to firemen of the U.S.A., Canada and many foreign countries. Their

entire career has been devoted to the manufacture of firemen's equipment, specializing in helmets, and while the business never reaches large proportions (mainly because of the long life of the product), the firm's record of continuous operation for a century is a tribute to energetic and honest management.

The trade-mark of the firm is a fireman striding through flames, with trumpet held aloft and

a child in his arms. Standing in the firm's office is a wooden statue of this trademark three feet high, wearing a miniature

helmet with his breast adorned by a solid gold badge. The figure was hewn from solid oak by an old carver of figure heads for sailing vessels in old times. This man, whose name is not known, was one of a group of volunteer firemen who for many years came daily to the old Gratacap shop and spent hours in talk, playing cribbage and smoking. An interesting reference to this group is found in an early history of the Volunteer Fire Department of the City of New York: "A certain place in Grand Street, neither a cigar store nor a rum shop, where fire laddies were wont to congregate," and said Mr. Gratacap, "blow fire-talk from daylight until ten at night. I gave them tobacco and water, but no liquor."

PRICES noted herein are f.o.b. New York, and are subject to change without notice.

TERMS are cash with order or C.O.D., unless otherwise arranged.

SHIPMENTS unless otherwise directed are made by parcels post or express, and will be sent C.O.D. unless remittance accompanies order.

REMITTANCES should be made by money order, but small amount may be sent in postage stamps. Cash should be sent by registered letter. If shipment is to be made by parcels post, remittance should include postage. We give shipping weights for most of the articles illustrated and your Post Office can advise you the amount of the postage. If weight is not given we can tell you the amount to send.
