2025 has three special 250<sup>th</sup> birthdays: in June it was the Army's, in November it will be the Marines, and this month is the U.S. Navy's. The founding of the U.S. Navy dates back to the Revolutionary War. George Washington created the United States' first naval fleet by converting three Massachusetts schooners into warships. The makeshift fleet's purpose was to intercept an British supply ship. The next day, Washington sent a letter to Congress urging them to establish a naval force. On October 13, the Continental Congress passed a resolution in order to create the Continental Navy. This date now represents the official establishment of the U.S. Navy. Some of the greatest naval victories were: Battle of Hampton Roads, 1862; Battle of the Atlantic, 1941-1945; Battle of Mobile Bay, 1864; Battle of Lake Erie, 1813; Battle of Philippine Sea, 1944; Battle of Flamborough Head, 1779; and of course Battle of Midway, 1942. These battles, and more, exemplify the bravery of our men and women during the most difficult times at sea. And to them, we raise our glass and salute them, thank them, and forever remember them.
