Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC)

NAEMT's Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) teaches EMS practitioners and other prehospital providers how to respond to and care for patients in a civilian tactical environment. It is designed to decrease preventable deaths in tactical situations. The course presents the three phases of tactical care:

- **Direct Threat Care** that is rendered while under attack or in adverse conditions.
- **Indirect Threat Care** that is rendered while the threat has been suppressed but may resurface at any point.
- **Evacuation Care** that is rendered while the casualty is being evacuated from the incident site.

The 16-hour classroom course covers the following topics:

- Hemorrhage control
- Surgical airway control and needle decompressions
- Strategies for treating wounded responders in threatening environments
- Techniques for dragging and carrying victims to safety

The course fee is \$275 for all Clinton Area & Corunna Area employees. For all non-employees, the course fee is \$300. The limit is 20 people.
