Joe & Zan Tyler, Joe Tyler is President of Followers in Fellowship, an organization committed to advancing Christian education. Joe spent thirty years as an information systems project manager. Joe and Zan homeschooled their three children through high school. Joe is Chairman of the Board for the South Carolina Association of Independent Homeschools (SCAIHS). Zan Tyler speaks to the heart of Christian parents like few others. Zan's own homeschool journey began in 1984 when she was threatened with jail. She has spent the past three decades advocating for homeschool freedom, publishing curriculum and resources, and joyfully equipping parents to thrive in their homeschool journey. She is an uplifting speaker, author, and the host of the Zan Tyler Podcast, an encouraging and practical weekly podcast with a new episode each Wednesday.

Featured Speakers

Jared Dodd and his wife, Amy, started a ministry focused on family and discipleship in 2012. They currently reside in Texas where they homeschool their ten children. Jared travels the country speaking on apologetics, family, homeschooling, discipleship, etc. He currently has over ten books published, has three video series on Rightnow Media, and 10.8 a radio/ podcast show (The Blessed Family). Teen Track Session Descriptions

Friday/Session 1 - Practical Apologetics:

The deception of the Enemy in our modern world seems overwhelming at times, especially for our young people. Is there scientific evidence for God? Does faith deny logic and reason? Chuck tackles these challenging questions and offers solid answers through practical apologetics.

Session 2 - Fighting Apathy:

More than ever before, raising teenagers that care about their faith is hard, especially in a culture that is quickly becoming increasingly hostile toward Christians. When a child enters those confusing years, the enemy uses dozens of weapons to rob them of their faith. Spiritual apathy is insidious and perhaps the most destructive of all. Chuck and his wife raised six children in this age of technology, learning to fight back against teen apathy and ultimately helping their children's faith not only survive, but thrive.

Session 3 - Defining Moments:

Every person has a dozen or so defining moments in their life that have the ability to change their future. Many people don't recognize them or at the very least, don't allow them to significantly impact their lives like God has intended them to. Chuck shares life examples, biblical lessons, and encouragement on how to recognize and respond to your next defining moment so that you are blessed, the kingdom is advanced, and your future is filled with purpose.

Saturday/Session 1 - Signs of the Times:

Biblical prophecy is being fulfilled in our lives today. God gave Daniel a profound prophecy regarding the coming of Jesus Christ and our Lord rebuked the people for not knowing the time of His coming. During His ministry, Jesus warned us over and over again to watch for Him that we might not be ashamed at His second coming. This session will help believers understand the signs of our times and help them prepare for that great day. This cliff notes Bible study of the End Times explores the three most common interpretations of the second coming of Christ. Chuck's non-dogmatic interpretation aligns predominantly with the pre-millennial view, but he finds great value in carefully considering varying biblical views held by Christian Bible scholars that teach other end time perspectives. The primary focus for this session will be to help believers prepare for future challenging days that will test their faith. Scripture reference for this session will be Matthew 24 and Revelation.

Session 2 - Career Fair:

This is a great opportunity for teens to visit with business owners who may have opportunities for them for the future. A full list of the business owners attending will be in your convention bag.

Session 3 - Revelation Generation:

Twenty-six hundred years ago, three teenagers stood in defiance to a powerful king. In our world of entertainment-minded youth, are we doing enough to prepare them for the possibility of challenging days ahead? Chuck encourages parents and teens to 'Know What You Believe', 'Know What's Coming', and 'Know What You Will Do' so that if the day should come, we will stand and not bow!






