Some people say that the best defence is a good offense; an octopus, however, would disagree. In addition to being one of the strangest and most beautiful creatures in nature, the octopus has some of the most inventive and effective defence techniques. While other animals have teeth, horns, or claws to help defend them from enemies, the octopus focuses on hiding from and confusing its attackers. When it wants to get away, the octopus has many tricks at hand.

The most well-known of the octopus's defence trick is its ability to emit clouds of ink into the water. After emitting the ink, the octopus hides into the ink cloud where the enemy cannot see it. Other octopi use the ink cloud as a decoy. They will release the ink cloud in one direction and run away in another direction, leaving their enemy with nothing but a mouthful of ink. In addition to confusing their sense of sight, these ink clouds also confuse their sense of smell. The ink is composed of a chemical which can shut down one's sense of smell. If an octopus cannot be seen or smelled, **it** has a much higher chance of escaping an attack.

Another defence mechanism possessed by many octopi is the ability to change colour. Some poisonous octopi, when provoked, will change their skin to a bright, eye-catching colour to warn enemies that they are dangerous and ready to strike. Other octopi use this ability to change their skin to the colour and texture of seaweed or coral, allowing them to blend in with their environment. Finally, some octopi use this colour-changing ability to look like other types of animals. The body of an octopus is highly flexible, and some species can combine this flexibility with their colour-changing skills to make themselves **resemble** more dangerous animals such as sea snakes.

Yet another defence mechanism possessed by some octopi is the ability to cut one of their limbs and regrow it later. When a predator catches a tentacle, the octopus can cut this tentacle, and regrow the it later. Some octopi, however, are even cleverer. When threatened by a predator, these octopi will shed a tentacle before being attacked in the hope that the predator will go after the detached tentacle rather than the octopus itself.

While other animals have teeth, horns, or claws to help defend them from enemies, the octopus focuses on hiding from and confusing its attackers. When it wants to get away, the octopus has many tricks at hand.

The most well-known of the octopus's defence trick is its ability to emit clouds of ink into the water. After emitting the ink, the octopus hides into the ink cloud where the enemy cannot see it. Other octopi use the ink cloud as a decoy. They will release the ink cloud in one direction and run away in another direction, leaving their enemy with nothing but a mouthful of ink. In addition to confusing their sense of sight, these ink clouds also confuse their sense of smell. The ink is composed of a chemical which can shut down one's sense of smell. If an octopus cannot be seen or smelled, it has a much higher chance of escaping an attack.

Another defence mechanism possessed by many octopi is the ability to change colour. Some poisonous octopi, when provoked, will change their skin to a bright, eye-catching colour to warn enemies that they are dangerous and ready to strike. Other octopi use this ability to change their skin to the colour and texture of seaweed or coral, allowing them to blend in with their environment. Finally, some octopi use this colour-changing ability to look like other types of animals. The body of an octopus is highly flexible, and some species can combine this flexibility with their colour-changing skills to make themselves resemble more dangerous animals such as sea snakes.

Yet another defence mechanism possessed by some octopi is the ability to cut one of their limbs and regrow it later. When a predator catches a tentacle, the octopus can cut this tentacle, and regrow the it later. Some octopi, however, are even cleverer. When threatened by a predator, these octopi will shed a tentacle before being attacked in the hope that the predator will go after the detached tentacle rather than the octopus itself.

They can eat their meals while still in flight. A dragonfly needs to be quick to escape hunters. While they search for prey, others look to prey on them. Barn swallows, a kind of birds, feed on bugs. They can reach 45 miles per hour which makes them fast enough to hunt dragonflies. Barn swallows eat up to 850 bugs a day. Just like dragonflies, they eat while in flight. Swallows need to be quick to stay alive, too. While they fill their bellies with bugs, other birds of prey like the hawks hunt them. Hawks look like the fierce hunters that they are. Although not the longest river in America, the Rio Grande is one of the most important. But, unlike other significant rivers, it is not used for shipping. This is because people use more water from the river than the river can get back from rain and other sources. More important, it is a symbol of cooperation between two nations. Though borders like the Rio Grande separate nations, they are also shared spaces. 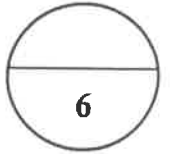

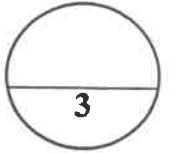
