We need a blood bank and modern equipment to do major surgeries. Hundreds of villagers are in urgent need of help."

The Lifeline Express train is not only treating patients but changing their social lives as well. Dr. Nagda is a surgeon who has volunteered to work on the Lifeline Express train for the last 16 years. He remembers receiving a wedding invitation from Sajida, a girl he once treated. 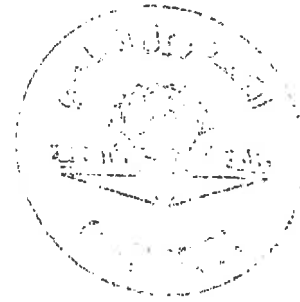
