The FIFA World Cup, the largest football competition in the world, has seen 80 nations compete over its history. According to FIFA reports, 1.12 billion viewers worldwide watched the 2018 Russia World Cup final match between Croatia and France. Played at Lusail Stadium in Qatar, an estimated 1.5 billion viewers from all corners of the globe watched the final match of the 2022 World Cup between Argentina and France. Rwanda, an African country, is witnessing major progress in the public health . This is the case of a 2-year-old girl named Ghislane. The little girl had been suffering from fever for several days. A nurse at the village healthcare centre in Rwanda told Ghislane's mother that she had malaria; a disease which is caused by mosquitoes. There was nothing the doctors could do, so they ordered the nurse to call an ambulance. But by the time Ghislane reached the main hospital, she stopped moving. Ghislane's mother said: "We arrived too late." She thought there was no hope for her daughter. The doctors said she needed a blood transfusion as the last resort.

Immediately, a hospital nurse typed a message on his smartphone. It was a request for two bags of blood. It was urgent. Normally, he would have sent a car and a driver to get the blood from a blood bank. This would take 3 hours. But this time, he tried something new. His phone received a confirmation message that the blood was on its way, and j! would be delivered soon.

In six minutes, the sound of a drone - a small like airplane - could be heard above the hospital. As it passed over the laboratory, the drone dropped a red box attached to a parachute. Inside the box were two bags of blood, still cold from refrigeration. A nurse rushed the red box to the emergency room. Within minutes, it was injected into Ghislane's body, and the girl opened her eyes.

In parts of rural Africa, many people die from simple diseases due to shortage of essential medicines. This problem was the inspiration for an American company. In March 2016, the American company in collaboration with the government of Rwanda launched the world's first drone delivery service. The drones carry vital medical supplies to hospitals by air. The company has delivered more than 7,000 units of blood products to 21 hospitals in the country.

These electric drones can fly 160 km on one charge. The drones can carry 2 kilos of blood products and reach more than half of Rwanda. Before launching a drone, a technician enters its destination on a tablet. The whole process takes about a minute. The drone flies using GPS. Once it gets near the hospital, it sends a text message announcing the exact arrival time. Then it slows down, drops its package, and goes back to its home base

Within minutes, it was injected into Ghislane's body, and the girl opened her eyes.

In parts of rural Africa, many people die from simple diseases due to shortage of essential medicines. This problem was the inspiration for an American company. In March 2016, the American company in collaboration with the government of Rwanda **launched** the world's first drone delivery service. The drones carry vital medical supplies to hospitals by air. 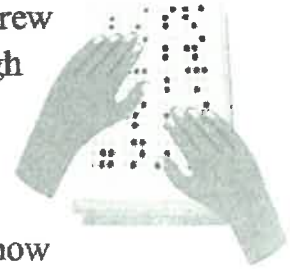

In 1824, at the age of 15, Louis Braille invented the Braille system for reading and writing. After losing his eyesight at the age of 5, Louis grew up learning by listening to stories and getting new information through hearing. He wasn't able to remember everything he was taught and wanted to read, write, and learn like everyone else. He learned about a communication system that was used to write private messages in the army and redesigned it to be simpler and easier to create and read. It is now the most valuable tool for communication for people who can't see.



Braille is a special system for reading and writing used by people who are blind or have very poor eyesight. The Braille system uses raised dots on paper that people can feel with their fingertips. Every set of dots represents a letter, a number, a mathematic or scientific symbol, and even punctuation such as periods and question marks. People move their fingers across the lines of dots. This way, they can feel the patterns and understand the letters and words. It takes some time and practice to learn how to read Braille, but it is useful.

Braille is not only used for educational books. It can be found on signs, elevator buttons, and even on some household items like shampoo bottles. This helps blind people to navigate their environment more easily and gain more freedom. **They** can read signs on the walls of public places, find the right floor in a building, and choose the right product in a store. Today, technology is also helping people who are blind. An electronic device called the "Portable Translator" can change any text into Braille. These devices make it easier for people to read e-mails, text messages, and other digital content.

For the Arab world, Braille has helped blind people read Arabic text easier. In 1986, the first copy of the Holy Quran in Braille became easily available in Saudi Arabia. In 2007 in Kuwait, the founder of Sakhr Software, Mr. Mohammed Al-Sharekh, created a program called ISBAR that **converts** Arabic text into Braille text.

In conclusion, Braille is a valuable tool for blind people. It allows them to read and write, giving them more freedom and access to information. This invention has made a big difference in the lives of many people around the world.
