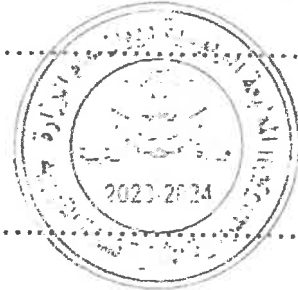

World science is controlled today by a small number of languages, including Japanese, German and French, but it is English which is the most popular language of science. This is not just because of the importance of English-speaking countries such as the USA in scientific research, but many non-English-speaking scientists find that they need to publish their research papers in English to reach a wide international audience. Before the 17th century, no one really knew how to write science in English while Latin was regarded as the official language of communication for European scholars.



The period between the 14th and the 16th centuries was full of interest in using the ancient language of science, Latin. At the same time, however, scholars also began to use the language of the new countries, such as England, as the modern language of science, exploration, and trade. England, as we know, took its language west to America and east to India. English was supported by scientific inventions such as the invention of the compass, improvements in cartography (the study of maps) and the new theories of astronomy (the study of planets) with its great expert, Copernicus, who lived for seventy years. Another example is Isaac Newton who published his mathematical ideas in Latin, but later published his theory of light in English.

There were several reasons why original science continued to be written in Latin. The first was simply that people used to look at scientists who speak Latin with more respect. A second reason for writing in Latin was the scientists' interest in keeping their research a secret till they were ready to make it available for the public. For example, mathematicians used to keep their work secret by writing it in a strange language like Latin. The third reason was that English did not have the necessary technical vocabulary and the grammatical resources which scientists needed to express their ideas formally. In simple words, English was scientifically weaker than Latin.

Finally, by the end of the 18th century, scientific English enjoyed large vocabulary growth that enabled it to advance and become the most distinguished language not only in science but also in other fields of life such as tourism, sports, arts and education.
