

## 'Brat' enjoys comedy career

HOLLYWOOD — Over the years television has prospered by presenting people you love to hate. Students of TV history say that one of the reasons for the success of "What's My Line" was because Dorothy Kilgallen was so eminently hateable. And Jonathan Harris, on "Lost in Space" was a man you enjoyed disliking.

But there never has been an utterly unpleasant child on TV until lately. "Little House on the Prairie" has one, and her name is Nellie Oelson on the show. The talented actress who plays this terrible tyke is Alison Arnglim.

And Alison loves to be hated. She takes pride in all the bratty things Nellie does.

"One of the worst things she ever did," Alison says, with relish, "was

when she forced a child with a lisp to recite 'Peter Piper.' Oh, and there was the time she persuaded a crippled girl with special shoes to go wading. That was very nasty."

Alison is, of course, just an actress playing a part. She is not nasty, bratty or awful. In fact, she seems to be a very nice lady, although she does have a wicked sense of humor.

Sometimes, though, people associate her with Nellie as though they were one person. Thus, many people in her audience, particularly small children, believe that Alison and Nellie are one and the same.

Once, Alison made the mistake of making a personal appearance at a fair wearing the Nellie Oelson costume. A couple of kids kicked her. She

doesn't do that any more.

Actually, Alison Arnglim is making a nice secondary career these days out of comedy. It's a far cry from being a brat to being a comedienne, but she's doing it. She is only 16, and she thinks she may be the world's youngest comedienne. She does her act at local Los Angeles clubs, and also is making some TV appearances. Her routine consists of material about her high school days and that sort of thing. She had some help in assembling her act from a professional team, The Village Idiots, but now she writes mostly her own material.

The Village Idiots are managed by her father, Thor Arnglim, a successful producer and personal manager. Alison's mother is Norman Mac-Millan, who was the voice of Casper, the friendly ghost, and many other voices. And Alison's big brother, Stefan, preceded her as an actor and has a very busy career.

So, she has always been in the show business world and becoming an actress was a natural step.

"My parents always talked about the business," she said. "And when Stefan was five or six, he felt left out, so he asked to be an actor too and they got him an audition and he got the part. I just followed along naturally."

But playing a brat was not exactly what she had in mind. Still, it is an interesting character, and she thinks it is better than playing a blob. At least, Nellie has character.

Alison and the other girls on "Little House" get along fine. She says that Melissa Sue Anderson, Melissa Gilbert and she are friendly. They get together off the set for birthday parties and other celebrations.

"The other two love roller coasters, but I don't," she said. "I stand in line with them until we get to the front, and then I get cold feet and don't go."

At 16, she is, of course, interested in boys. And she has her own heroes among the Hollywood male stars.

"My idol, and don't you go 'ich' or I'll stick a fork in your nose, is Sylvester Stallone. When I talk about him on the set, the other girls go 'ich.' But I think he's cute and I saw 'Rocky' more times than is healthy."

She'd like to meet him, of course. But she won't be in costume. She's afraid he'll kick her.
