Raghubir Singh Memorial PM SHRI Govt. Model Senior Secondary School, ANN is situated at ANNI-JABAN-NAGDHAR Road, 1/2 Km. outside sounds and fury of Main Bazaar in a calm and quite environment. The school has a spacious Playground, beautiful buildings and campus with attractive looks. The school campus is surrounded by other buildings of residential colony and beautiful pine forests up on the mountainous terrains. Being situated at the base of high mountains around it, here average sunshine in winter months is around 2 hours only. In summer i.e. May and June, atmosphere is very hot and dry. On the whole, climate of the place is quite extreme. Our school got the status of PM SHRI in Dec. 2023.

# Population and their Main Occupations:-

Population of this town is about 3000 and that of the surrounding sub-villages is about 3500. About 1000 students come here to learn climbing down from the steep mountains of the valley. Range of distance from the school of these villages is between 0 to 8 Km.

Occupationally most of the people are orchardists, especially apple growers. Some of them are agriculturists and businessmen also. Therefore, mostly they try their best to render quality education to their children.

## Other Activities in the School:-

NSS unit is functional in the school. NSS unit aware the community regarding social services so that social values be inculcated in the students. ECO-CLUB is also framed in the school with the co-operation of students and teachers. The club works for Environmental Protection and awareness about nature among the people. Consumer club is also organized in this institution. This club aware the students about rights and duties of the consumers. Monthly quiz contests is also organized in the end of every month.

NCC unit is also functional in the school. The aim of NCC unit is to develop the patriotism in the students and to create a pool of motivated and trained the students who can serve the country in any field.

I.T. (Information Technology) facility is also provided for the students in this school. The school has a big Library comprising a large number of books and daily newspapers are also available for the students for enhancement of their knowledge. Facility of well-established Science Laboratory is also is also available for the effective teaching of science subjects.

The Govt. has introduced to vocational course (Security & health Care in the School for 9th to +2 classes these courses are running smoothly.

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#### 18. ORGANISE INTERNAL MONITORING AND EVALUATION PROCESS:


