Carrots and parsnips must have foliage trimmed to 3in. (7.5cm). Beans must be displayed with stalk attached. Tomatoes must be displayed with calyxes (the green flower bud case). The tray, board or staging must be flat. A black cloth is permitted, and the tray may be painted.

National Dahlia Society rules above will apply, bikini vases are encouraged, but other non-glass vases are also accepted. Judge's discretion may also be used to encourage novices





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SECTION E FLORAL ART

All exhibits may be created on site or assembled at home prior to the show. All classes are open to all ages and skill levels.

Class 78. "Afternoon Tea"

A Miniature arrangement in a space no more than 6" x 6" and 9" in height.

Class 79. "Spain"

An arrangement representing the country of Spain in a space no more than 24" x 24" and 30" in height.

Class 80. "On the Beach"

An arrangement on a plate no more than 12" x 12" and 9" in height **For young persons up to and including age 12.**

PLEASE NOTE:

All entries must comply with size restrictions. Plant material should have roots or cut stem ends in water or water retaining material. Artificial (silk/plastic/paper etc) flowers are not permitted

Any entries which do not meet the requirements above may be disqualified.

SECTION F - SOFT HANDICRAFT

All classes are open to all ages and skill levels. Items must be displayed in an area no larger than 20in x 20in. (50cm x 50cm).

- Class 85. One article of needlework clothing
- Class 86. One article of needlework other than clothing

All classes are open to all ages and skill levels. Items must be displayed in an area no larger than 20in x 20in. ($50c^{m}x 50c^{m}$).

- **Class 99. One painting** watercolour only (*Watercolour is any paint that uses water as a medium this includes gouache*)

THE SANDY GARDEN & CRAFT SHOW RULES

- This is an Amateur show. The fee for each entry is 50p.
- Judges will be selected from affiliated societies (RHS, NDS, WI) and local experts.
- The Show will be under the management of the Show Committee and the judge's decision is final. The judges are at liberty to withhold prizes for want of competition or lack of merit.
- Any entry not complying with the schedule may be disqualified by the judge. All entries must be received by 12 noon on Thursday 28th August 2025. An exhibitor can enter as many classes as they wish to, including multiple entries into any individual class.

Definition of a novice:

<u>Section A – Class 4 (Vegetable Collection)</u>: A novice is a person who has not previously won a first prize for exhibiting vegetables, of any kind, in any show. <u>Section C - Class 223 (Dahlia Collection)</u>: A novice is a person who has not previously won first prize for exhibiting Dahlias in any show.

- Exhibitor entry cards must be collected on arrival at the show and placed under an entry so that the exhibitor's name is not visible to the judge.
- All produce must be cleaned and washed before entering the hall, although minor dressing of produce is permitted at time of staging.
- All exhibits to be shown on exhibitor's own trays, plates, dishes etc.
 - In section C (Dahlias) should be exhibited in 'bikini' vases and all stems should be de-budded.
 - In section E (Floral Art) any visible containers may be judged.
 - In section H (Cookery) exhibits should be displayed on a paper plate and covered with a single layer of cling-film.
- All exhibits, personal property, etc. will be the responsibility of the exhibitor. The Committee will not be liable for any loss or damage due to any cause.




THE SANDY GARDEN & CRAFT SHOW RULES – Continued

- All exhibits must be staged either on Friday 29th August between 6.30pm & 8.30pm or on Saturday 30th August between 7.30am & 10.15am. at which time the hall will be closed for judging. At least one steward or committee member will be present throughout the period of the show.
- No exhibit may be removed from the hall until after the Prize Presentation on Saturday 30th August, unless prior permission has been obtained. Prizes will be awarded on the understanding that the exhibit has been grown or made by that exhibitor. Exhibitors presenting items not of their own doing, may be restricted from entering future shows.
- Trophies/shields will be awarded at 4.00pm on Saturday 30th August. Prize monies may be collected from the Treasurer after 2.00pm on that day.
- Any item of produce/craft work etc that is not collected immediately after the Presentations will be assumed to be not required by its owner and will be available to the public provided a donation is given.
- All trophies or shields are perpetual and can be held by the winners until the last day of July of the following year at which time they should be returned to the Association. All cups are insured by the Association.

1. THE RHS BANKSIAN MEDAL

Awarded to the competitor with the largest amount of prize money in Horticultural sections A, B, C and D(excluding classes 1,4,23-30, and 77) regardless of any prize substitution or sponsorship. Any competitor who won the medal in the two previous years is not eligible to compete. This is based on RHS information.

<u>2 & 3.</u> THE NATIONAL DAHLIA SOCIETY'S SILVER AND BRONZE MEDALS

To be awarded to the exhibitors with the best and next-best exhibits in the Dahlia section of the show. To be awarded at the Judge's discretion.

<u>4 & 5. THE WORSHIPFUL COMPANY OF GARDENERS' DIPLOMAS FOR EXCELLENCE IN</u> HORTICULTURE

Two diplomas will be awarded, one to the exhibitor with the best collection of vegetables (Class 2) and one to the exhibitor with the best salad collection (Class 3).

6. THE WORSHIPFUL COMPANY OF GARDENERS' AWARD

Awarded to the exhibitor with the first prize in class 78 (young person's floral art).

<u>7. THE BEDFORD CUP</u> Most points in sections A, B, C and D.

Donated by Bedfordshire Agricultural Society


