# BOOK CLASS ACTIVITIES

#### 01 - Storybook Reading

Students read the storybook together with the teacher, and the discussion is engaged.

### 02 - Chapter Comprehension & Vocabulary Practice

Students complete comprehension questions from the Novel Workbook and engage in vocabulary-building through sentence making and diary writing homework.

 ★ Educational games (like synonym-building and word challenges) are used in class to make vocabulary learning fun and memorable.

#### 03 - Mid-Term Test

(After completing half of the storybook)
A short test is given to check the student's understanding of the first half of the book.



#### 04 - Literary Skill Development

(After Completing the Storybook)

Students learn about *Plot Mountains* (*Freytag's Pyramid*), write about themes, and analyse characters to deepen their literary understanding.

#### 05 - End-Term Test

A final book test is given to assess overall comprehension, vocabulary, and story understanding.

#### 06 - Next Storybook

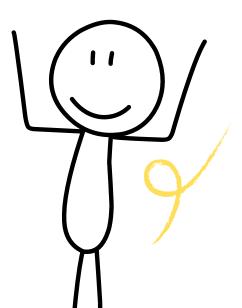
The cycle continues with a new storybook, helping students improve and grow with each new and *more complex read*.



# BOOK CLASS OVERVIEW

Have fun!

At OHT, our Book Class is designed to help students aged 8 to 15 strengthen their reading comprehension, vocabulary, and critical thinking through engaging storybooks. Each session combines guided reading with structured workbook activities, vocabulary development, and comprehension practice. For students in Year 6 and above, additional materials from the Cambridge Checkpoint test papers are included to provide extra comprehension support. Students also practise summary writing and sentence-making — a traditional yet highly effective method for improving clarity and written expression. Beyond academic progress, this class nurtures a genuine love for reading and meaningful discussion.

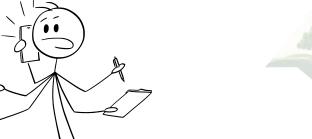
