Stendhal, Goethe, Mary Shelley, Mark Twain, Turner, Liszt... All were captivated by the landscape, the historic villas, and the elegant villages reflected in the water.

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## RECOMMENDED ITINERARY

(Ideal route over 1, 2, or 3 days — with travel options by boat, car, or bike)

### 1. Como – The Gateway

The starting point of the cultural journey. Travelers arrived here from Milan, drawn by the Cathedral, the medieval walls, and the first glimpses of the lake.

**Highlights:**

- Como Cathedral
- Villa Olmo (frequented by poet Ugo Foscolo)
- Lake promenade and Teatro Sociale



### 2. Cernobbio – Elegance and Contemplation

A favorite stop for lovers of tranquility, Cernobbio was synonymous with refined holidays.

**Highlights:**

- Villa d'Este (now a luxury hotel, once a noble residence)
- Lakeside promenade
- View of Mount Bisbino

Composer Franz Liszt and Countess d'Agoult stayed here.







### 3. LENNO & VILLA DEL BALBIANELLO – LITERARY CHARM AND ADVENTURE

A place of inspiration for writers, travelers, and filmmakers. Frequented by explorers, collectors, and patrons.

**Highlights:**

- Villa del Balbianello
- Panoramic gardens
- Boat trip across the “Zoca de l’Oli” bay

🎬 Mentioned by Lord Byron and featured in famous films (\*Star Wars\*, \*James Bond\*).



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## 4. Tremezzo – Art and Romantic Gardens

One of the most beloved stops for Europe's aristocratic tourism.

### Highlights:

- Villa Carlotta: masterpieces by Canova, Hayez, and a botanical garden
- Panoramic view of Bellagio
- Lakeside promenade

## 5. Bellagio – The Heart of the Grand Tour



The promontory where the waters split into two branches was considered “the most beautiful spot in Italy” by Stendhal.

### Highlights:

- Villa Melzi d'Eril and gardens
- Historic village and staircases
- Villa Serbelloni (now the Rockefeller Foundation)

Described in the works of Flaubert, Twain, Longfellow, and Liszt.



## 6. Varenna – Silent Poetry on the Eastern Shore

Once less worldly and more intimate, Varenna was a refuge for sensitive souls and poets. Today, it is a must-visit destination for the charm of its landscape — a little gem waiting to be discovered.

### Highlights:

- Villa Monastero
- Lover's Walk
- Church of San Giorgio

Beloved by Mary Shelley and Northern European painters.

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## 7. Menaggio – Watercolor Landscapes

Visited by 19th-century English and German painters.

### Highlights:

- Historic center
- Belvedere Garibaldi
- Easy hikes with lake views

A base for plein-air paintings and travel diaries.







## 8. Lecco – The Branch of \*The Betrothed\*

The eastern branch of Lake Como, immortalized by the writer Alessandro Manzoni in the celebrated novel *The Betrothed*, is a symbolic place for all Italians and a cultural reference for foreign travelers passionate about historical novels.

### Highlights:

- Villa Manzoni (birthplace of the author, now a museum)
- Azzone Visconti Bridge
- Lakeside promenade
- Trails through Pescarenico, the Innominato's fortress, and Mount Resegone

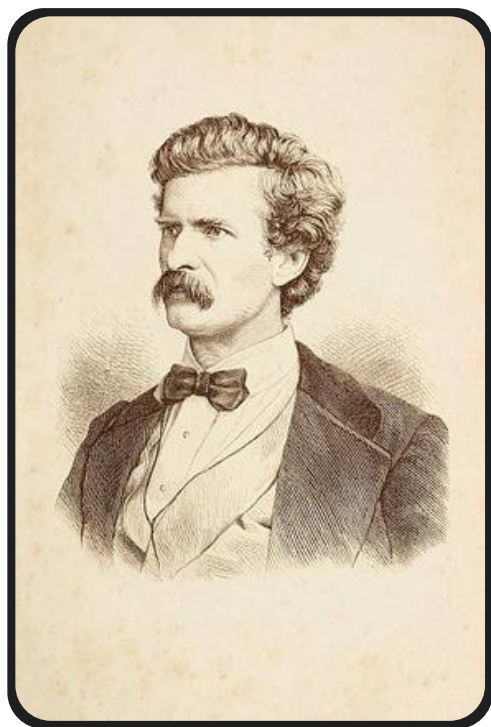

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## LOCAL TIPS FOR THE GRAND TOUR ON LAKE COMO

- **Avoid peak hours** in main towns like Bellagio, Varenna, and Como, especially on summer weekends. Early morning or late afternoon are best to enjoy places without crowds.
- Try **\*polenta uncia\*** (polenta with butter and cheese) in a traditional trattoria, especially in small restaurants away from tourist areas.
- **Chat with artisans** at local markets or workshops—they often share unique lake stories and tips for hidden spots.
- Choose **slow travel on traditional ferries** instead of hydrofoils for better views and a more relaxed journey.
- Visit **lesser-known churches** rich in history and art, like the Basilica of San Giacomo in Bellagio or San Lorenzo in Mandello del Lario.
- Book dinner at an **agriturismo or countryside “cascina”** to taste zero-mile products and traditional dishes.
- Take **lesser-known scenic trails**, like the Valle dei Mulini path in Civenna or the trail from Lecco to Colico.
- Join **village festivals**, especially in spring and autumn, for music, food, and local traditions in an authentic atmosphere.
- For coffee or an aperitivo with a view, ask for **“off-the-radar” spots** like Bar Vapore in Varenna or Caffè Monti in Bellagio, frequented more by locals than tourists.
