

STOPS ALONG THE ROUTE

(Ideal route over 1, 2, or 3 days — with travel options by boat, car, or bike)



1. Como – The Starting Point

Who: Johann Wolfgang von Goethe

What: Visited Como in 1786 during his Italian Journey.

He admired the lake landscape and the Cathedral.

 “This lake surpasses in beauty everything I have seen so far.”

To see: Piazza Duomo, lakeside promenade, Villa Olmo (which hosted Ugo Foscolo).



2. Cernobbio – Elegance and Contemplation

Who: Franz Liszt, Gioachino Rossini

What: Musicians in search of peace and inspiration. Liszt wrote passionate letters from the lake.

 Liszt and Countess d'Agoult stayed here during their scandalous love affair.

To see: The gardens, architecture, and romantic lake views.

3. Tremezzo – Villa Carlotta

Who: English and German travelers, Romantic artists

What: Its botanical gardens and artworks (Canova, Hayez) were highlights of 19th-century art tours.

 A must-see on the Grand Tour.

To see: Canova's sculptures and the landscapes beloved by British watercolorists.



4. Bellagio – The Pearl of the Lake



Who: Stendhal, Flaubert, Longfellow, Twain

What: All were enchanted by the lush promontory and the villas surrounded by greenery.

 “The most beautiful place in the world.” – Stendhal

To see:

- Villa Melzi: visited by Liszt and Byron
- Villa Serbelloni: now home to the Rockefeller Foundation

5. Varenna – Poetic Tranquility

Who: Mary and Percy Shelley, northern European writers and travelers

What: The quiet and contemplative atmosphere of the eastern shore inspired poets and mystics.

📸 Perfect for photography and reflection.

To see: Villa Monastero, the “Walk of Love” lakeside path.

6. Menaggio – Watercolor Landscapes

Who: 19th-century English painters and illustrators

What: A resting place for open-air sketching.

🎨 The alpine scenery and contrast between lake and mountain were favorite subjects.

7. LENNO - VILLA DEL BALBIANELLO

Who: 20th-century explorers and writers

What: Once owned by Guido Monzino, it hosted artists and film directors.

📍 Filming location for Star Wars and James Bond 007, but loved long before by travelers of past centuries.

8. Lecco – The City of Manzoni and The Betrothed

Who: Alessandro Manzoni

What: The author of *I Promessi Sposi* (“The Betrothed”), Italy’s most famous historical novel, lived and was inspired here.

The landscapes of Lecco and its surroundings became the vivid setting for his story of love and faith.

⌚ The “Resegone” mountain, the Azzone Visconti Bridge, and the villages of Pescarenico and Acquate.

To see: Manzoni’s home, the Manzoni Museum, and the itinerary “I Luoghi Manzoniani”.

Following the footsteps of artists on Lake Como is more than a cultural itinerary, it's an emotional journey.

Every stop reveals not only masterpieces and stories, but also the quiet charm that continues to inspire travelers today.

The same light that enchanted Turner still glows on the water; the same silence that moved Manzoni still lingers between the mountains.

- **Local Tips:**
- **Best time to visit:** Spring and early autumn, when the colors are vibrant and the crowds thinner.
- **How to explore:** Combine public ferries (“Navigazione Lago di Como”) with short walks to fully enjoy the landscapes that inspired painters and poets.
- **Hidden gems:** Visit Pescarenico in Lecco at sunrise, walk the Lover’s Promenade in Varenna at sunset, and stop at a lakeside café in Tremezzo for an espresso with a view.
- **Cultural break:** Many villas (Villa Carlotta, Villa Melzi, Villa Monastero) host art exhibitions and concerts — check their seasonal programs.
- **Don’t rush:** Lake Como reveals its beauty slowly. Sit by the shore, listen to the water, and let the same timeless muse speak to you — as it did to Goethe, Shelley, and Manzoni.
