Security and Stability

Iran carries out an average of 1,300 executions annually one of the highest rates in the world

In Iran, over one million children are denied education, facing hunger and state violence.

Iran's Stability After the Fall

A Planned Transition

Iran's democratic opposition has spent years preparing a clear roadmap for the day after the regime falls.

In the first 100 days, a provisional council will keep Energy, transport, and hospitals running preventing unrest or a power vacuum.

Europe's Concerns Addressed

Borders will be reinforced to prevent extremism and curb unauthorized migration. Nuclear sites will be placed under international supervision, and Western contracts will stay protected by law.
