DAY 1: SAN GIMIGNANO


Start your exploration in San Gimignano, known as the "City of Towers" for its many perfectly preserved medieval towers. Stroll through its cobbled streets, visit the Piazza della Cisterna and admire the Torre Grossa, the tallest in the city, from which you can enjoy a breathtaking panoramic view. Don't miss a visit to the Torture Museum for a dive into medieval history.

Recommended duration: Half day



Monteriggioni, with its intact medieval walls and towers dominating the skyline, will transport you straight to the Middle Ages. Walk along the patrol path along the walls for an extraordinary view of the Sienese hills. Visit the Church of Santa Maria Assunta, a small Romanesque jewel. For a complete experience, stop by the Museum of Armor and learn about the history of medieval battles.

Recommended duration: Half day



Continue to Volterra, one of the best-preserved Etruscan cities in Italy, famous for its alabaster production. Visit the Roman Theater, dating back to the 1st century BC, and the Palazzo dei Priori, the oldest town hall in Discover Etruscan Tuscany. history at the Guarnacci Etruscan Museum, which houses artifacts of extraordinary importance. End the day with a walk along the medieval walls. Recommended

duration: 1 day








DAY 4: PIENZA AND MONTEPULCIANO

End your journey by visiting two jewels of the Val d'Orcia: Pienza and Montepulciano. In Pienza, the ideal city of the Renaissance, visit Piazza Pio II and the Duomo, and don't forget to taste the famous local pecorino cheese. Montepulciano, explore the underground cellars that preserve the famous Vino Nobile di Montepulciano and visit the Temple of San Biagio, a Renaissance masterpiece.

Recommended duration: 1 day

This 4-day itinerary will allow you to explore the timeless beauty of Tuscany, immersing yourself in its history, art and gastronomy. Remember to bring a camera and a journal to note down your travel impressions and preserve the memories of these unique experiences.
