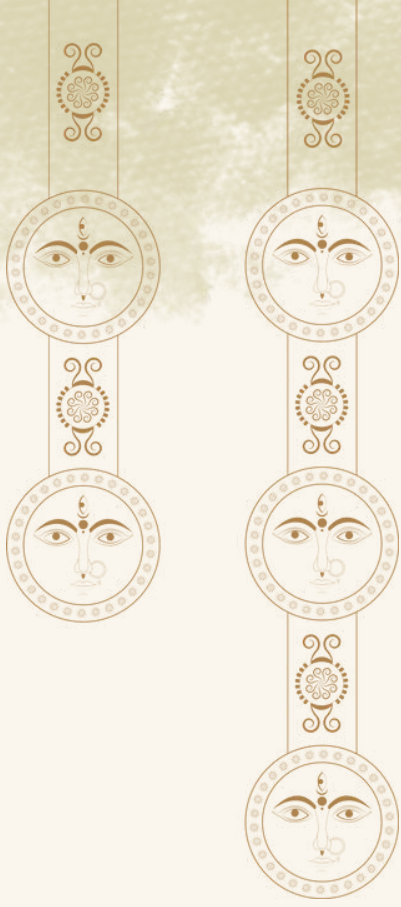

ক্রয়ডন বাঙালী সংযোগ



সম্পাদকীয়

বিশ্বরূপে বিশালাক্ষি বিদ্যাং দেহি নমোহস্ত তে।।

কাগজে-কলমে বসন্ত এলেও ব্রিটেনে তার আসতে সময় লাগে। শীত রাণী যেন সবে নিজের ঘর সাজিয়ে নিয়েছেন, আর তাঁর অনুচরেরা—ছোট দিন, দীর্ঘ রাত, বরফ, বৃষ্টি আর ব্ল্যাক আইস—চারদিকে রাজত্ব চালাচ্ছে। তবু ফেব্রুয়ারি মাসে প্রথম কুঁড়ি ফোটা স্নোড্রপ আর ড্যাফোডিল আমাদের বলে, "ফুল ফুটুক না ফুটুক, আজ বসন্ত।" তাপমাত্রা শূন্যের নিচে থাকলেও, কিংবা তুষারপাতের পূর্বাভাস মিললেও, বসন্তের উষ্ণতার ছোঁয়া আমাদের মন ছুঁয়েই যায়।

এমনই এক মুহুর্তে আমরা, ক্রয়ডন বেঙ্গলি কানেকশনের সদস্যরা, প্রস্তুতি শুরু করেছি মা সরস্বতীর আরাধনার।

২০১২ সালে দক্ষিণ লন্ডনের ক্রয়ডন এলাকায় কয়েকজন উদ্যমী বাঙালির উদ্যোগে প্রতিষ্ঠিত হয় ক্রয়ডন বেঙ্গলি কানেকশন। সেই বছরই আমাদের প্রথম সরস্বতী পূজা। তারপর থেকে প্রতি বছর আমরা নিষ্ঠার সঙ্গে পূজার আয়োজন করে আসছি। এমনকি ২০২১ সালে, যখন গোটা বিশ্ব কোভিডের প্রভাবে স্তব্ধ, তখনো আমরা থেমে থাকিনি। প্রযুক্তির মাধ্যমে ভার্চুয়াল পূজা এবং সাংস্কৃতিক অনুষ্ঠান চালিয়ে গিয়েছি।

এ বছর, আমরা ১৪তম সরস্বতী পূজা উদযাপন করছি। একে আমরা হাস্যরসে বলি, পূজা এখন টিনএজ বয়সে পা রাখল। পূজার প্রস্তুতি শুরু হয়েছে অনেক মাস আগে। নিয়মিত মিটিং, আলোচনা আর পরিশ্রমের ফসল আমাদের এই অনুষ্ঠান। তবে মুদ্রাস্ফীতি এবং দ্রব্যমূল্যের উর্ধ্বগতির কারণে এ বছর চ্যালেঞ্জ অনেক বড়। তবুও, আমাদের বিশ্বাস, সকলের ঐকান্তিক প্রচেষ্টা আর শুভানুধ্যায়ীদের অকৃপণ সমর্থনে আমরা আবার সফলভাবে পূজার আয়োজন করতে পারব।

১ম ফেব্রুয়ারি, ক্রয়ডনের সেলসডন কমিউনিটি হল সেজে উঠবে সরস্বতী পূজার রঙে। দেশ থেকে আনা চাঁদমালা, কাগজের শিকল, আর টিস্যু পেপারের ফুলে পূজা প্রাঙ্গণ পাবে এক নিজস্ব সৌন্দর্য। ছোটদের কোলাহলে মুখরিত পরিবেশ আমাদের স্মরণ করিয়ে দেবে বাংলার সেই বসন্ত উৎসব।

সরস্বতী পূজা কেবল একটি ধর্মীয় অনুষ্ঠান নয়, এটি আমাদের শিকড়, ঐতিহ্য, এবং সংস্কৃতির সঙ্গে গভীর সংযোগ। এটি আমাদের একত্র করে, আমাদের পরিচয়কে আরও দৃঢ় করে।

এই বছর আমরা সবাই মিলে স্মৃতিচারণ করব শৈশবের সরস্বতী পূজার দিনগুলোর। হাড়কাঁপানো ঠান্ডায় গায়ে হলুদ মেখে, হলুদ শাড়ি পরে, অঙ্ক বই মায়ের চরণে রেখে অঞ্জলি দেওয়ার সেই দিনগুলো আজও আমাদের মনে রয়ে গেছে। স্কুলের পূজোর থিচুড়ি, বেগুনি আর পায়সের স্মৃতি যেন চিরন্তন।

পরিবর্তন সময়ের সঙ্গী, তবু ঐতিহ্যের প্রতি আমাদের ভালোবাসা অটুট। তাই এই বসন্তে আমরা সবাই মিলে আবার একত্র হব নতুন উদ্যমে, নতুন আশায়।

মা সরস্বতীর আশীর্বাদে সবার জীবনে আসুক জ্ঞান, আনন্দ, এবং সাফল্য।

সরস্বতী পূজার প্রাণশক্তি বরাবরই আমাদের কচিকাঁচার। ১৪ বছর আগে যখন এই পূজা শুরু হয়, তখন এদের কেউ কেউ ছিল অনাগত, কেউ সবে টলোমলো পায় হাঁটতে শিখেছে, আবার কেউবা প্রাথমিক বিদ্যালয়ে পা রেখেছে। আজ তারা সবাই সেকেন্ডারি স্কুলে, আর কয়েকজন বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের দোরগোড়ায়। পড়াশোনার পাশাপাশি খেলাধুলা, সংগীত ও অন্যান্য সৃজনশীল কর্মকাণ্ডে এরা সমান দক্ষ। পূজোর এক মাস আগে থেকেই শুরু হয় সাংস্কৃতিক অনুষ্ঠানের মহড়া। শনিবার ও রবিবার সন্ধ্যাগুলো এদের কলরবে মুখর হয়ে ওঠে। পূজোর দিন কুইজ শো পরিচালনা, দর্শনার্থীদের অভ্যর্থনা, চাঁদা সংগ্রহ এবং সাংস্কৃতিক অনুষ্ঠানের দায়িত্ব সামলাতে এদের ভূমিকা অপরিসীমা। এই প্রবাসের মাটিতেও এরা বাংলায় কথা বলে, বাংলায় ভাবনা বিনিময় করে এবং নিজেদের শিকড়কে গভীরভাবে আঁকড়ে ধরে।

ক্রয়ডন বেঙ্গলি কানেকশন (CBC) সারা বছর জুড়ে নানা সাংস্কৃতিক ও সমাজসেবামূলক কর্মকাণ্ডে অংশগ্রহণ করে। কালীপূজা ও সরস্বতী পূজোর পাশাপাশি প্রতিবছর পয়লা বৈশাখ এবং বিজয়া দশমী উদযাপন করা হয়। এছাড়া, স্থানীয় ও আন্তর্জাতিক চ্যারিটি ফান্ড রেইজিং-এ আমাদের সক্রিয় অংশগ্রহণ সমাজের প্রতি দায়িত্ব পালনের একটি উজ্জ্বল উদাহরণ।

My first Duke of Edinburgh experience

Embarking on my first Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) expedition was an exciting, nerve-wracking and a rewarding experience. I had always heard about the DofE award as a challenging but valuable adventure, but I didn't realize just how much it would push me out of my zone and teach me about myself, others, and the world around me. The DofE journey begins with preparation, and for me, that was where the challenge started. The first task was the training session. My group and I learnt how to navigate using maps and compasses, how to cook outdoors, how to pack light but efficiently for a multi-day expedition, and the essential skills of teamwork and communication as well as key life skills. At first, the skills felt overwhelming and daunting, especially the idea of navigating in the wilderness with nothing but a map and a compass. I was used to the convenience of smartphones and GPS, so the concept of relying solely on traditional methods was intimidating. However, as I began practicing, I gained confidence, and soon, I was able to navigate a small route near my home with relative ease.



Once the preparation was done, it was time for the expedition itself. The day we set out, I felt a mix of excitement and anxiety. The weather was unpredictable, and I wasn't sure how my body would manage the physical exertion. My group and I set off with our heavy backpacks, filled with food, sleeping bags, tents, and all the gear we would need to survive for the next two days. The first few hours were tough; my shoulders were sore from the weight of my pack, and the path was steeper than I had imagined. But as we moved forward, the initial discomfort faded into the background as I focused on the journey ahead.

One of the most surprising aspects of the expedition was the sense of camaraderie that developed between the members of my group. We had all come from diverse backgrounds, with different strengths and weaknesses, but the shared experience of navigating the wilderness together created an understanding between us. We took turns leading the group, made sure no one was left behind, and encouraged each other when we hit a tough patch. At times, the trail seemed endless, and there were moments when I wanted to give up, but the support of my team kept me going.

When we finally reached our campsite, the exhaustion was real, but there was also a sense of pride. We had managed to navigate through the challenging terrain, and now we had to set up camp. I had never pitched a tent before, and I was amazed at how quickly I learned to set it up and create a makeshift kitchen to cook our meals. After some relaxation we went to explore our campsite and found a playground next to a river. After playing at the playground for a while, the tiredness hit us. As we went back to our tents, we noticed our managers were roasting marshmallows! They were delicious. One of my teammates brought hot chocolate and biscuits so before bed we all had a cup of hot chocolates and biscuits. Before going to sleep, our team and another team went inside one tent and played some rounds of UNO. It was so much fun.

The next day brought new challenges. The weather turned colder, and we had to hike through heavy rain, which made navigation even more difficult. We had to rely heavily on our training, as the visibility was limited, and the trail was often unclear. There were times when we doubted ourselves, but we pushed through, trusting the skills we had. By the time we reached the finish line, my legs were sore, my feet were aching, but the sense of accomplishment was amazing. We had done it. We had completed our first DofE expedition.

Looking back on that experience, I realize how much I gained from it. DofE taught me more than just how to navigate a map or pitch a tent. It taught me about resilience, problem-solving, and teamwork. It showed me how to face challenges head-on and how to keep moving forward, even when things seem difficult. It also helped me build my confidence and independence. I learned how capable I really am, and that I can manage much more than I initially thought.



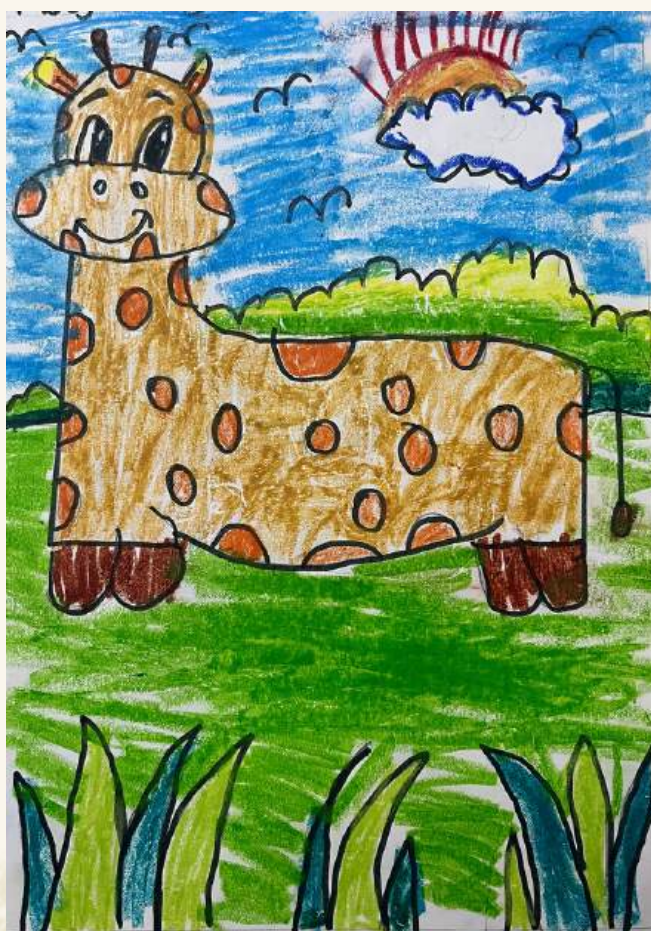
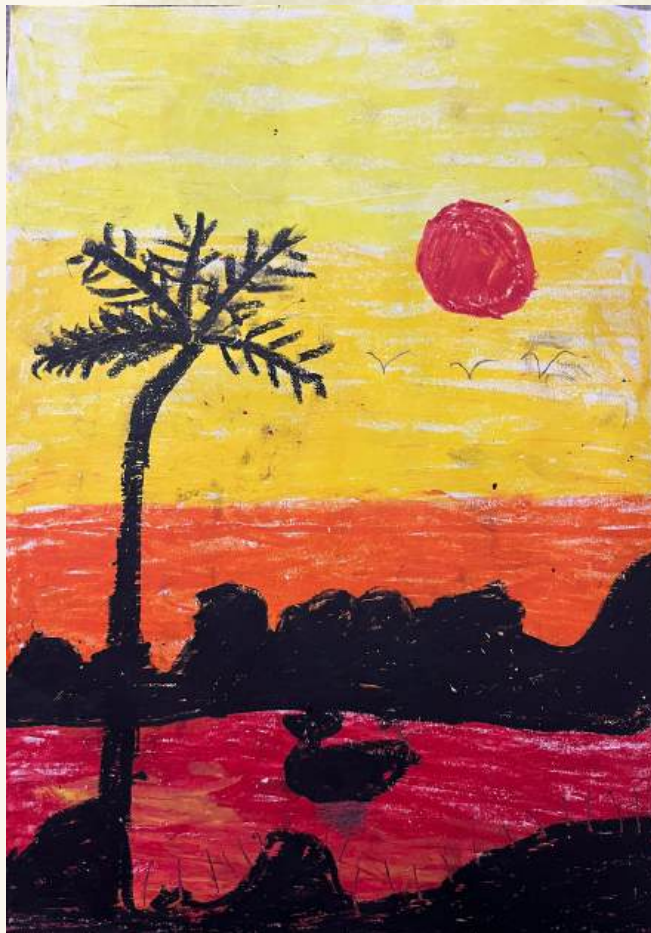

I came out of it with a new sense of confidence and a deep appreciation for teamwork, perseverance, and the beauty of nature. DofE may have started as a challenge, but it ended up being one of the most memorable and valuable experiences of my life, one that I will carry with me as I continue to grow and face new challenges.

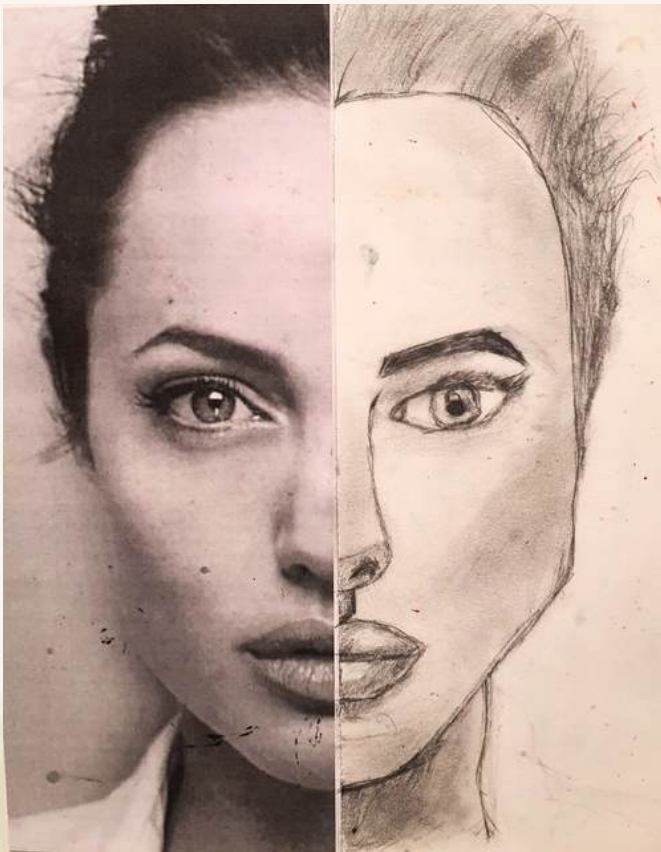

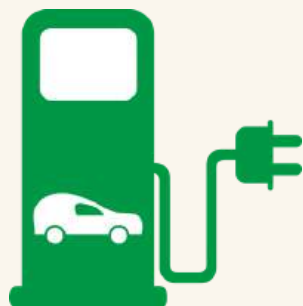
Types of Fuel

There are various types of fuels available in the world today. Primarily there are three types of fuel based on their natural properties which are Solid fuels, Liquid fuels, and Gaseous fuels.

Solid fuel refers to distinct types of solid material that are used as fuel to produce energy and provide heating, usually released through combustion. Solid fuels include wood, charcoal, peat, coal, and pellets made from wood, corn, wheat, rye, and other grains. Liquid fuels are combustible or energy-generating molecules that can be harnessed to create mechanical energy, usually producing kinetic energy. Most liquid fuels in widespread use are derived from the fossilized remains of dead plants and animals by exposure to heat and pressure inside the Earth crust. There are several types, such as hydrogen fuel (for automotive uses), ethanol, jet fuel and biodiesel, which are all categorized as liquid fuels. Fuel gas is any one of several fuels that are gaseous under ordinary conditions. Fuel gases often consist of hydrocarbons (such as methane or propane), hydrogen, carbon monoxide, or combinations of these components. Examples of fuel gases include hydrogen, propane, methane, coal gas, water gas, blast furnace gas, coke oven gas, and CNG.

Fossil Fuel Cars

Fossil fuels contain high percentages of carbon and include coal, petroleum, and natural gas. They range from volatile materials with low carbon to hydrogen ratios like methane, to liquid petroleum to non-volatile materials composed of almost pure carbon, like anthracite coal. Fossil fuels are non-renewable as they take millions of years to form and are used faster than they are created. So, we must conserve these fuels and use them judiciously. The production and use of fossil fuels raise environmental concerns. A global movement toward the generation of renewable energy is therefore under way to help meet increased energy needs. Rudolph Diesel invented the diesel engine, which utilizes diesel fuel to generate electricity. A Scottish chemist named James Young discovered petrol in 1847. Petrol is a flammable yellowish liquid that powers engines in vehicles like speedboats, cars, buses, and motorcycles.



Future Fuels

Cars of modern days use alternate forms of fuel which are more environmentally friendly. The alternate forms of fuel include Electrical, Hybrid (electrical and petrol) and Hydrogen. Hybrid cars use both a petrol or diesel engine and an electric motor, so they use less fuel than a traditional car. The electrical motor helps the car run more smoothly and the cars produce less Carbon Dioxide emissions than petrol or diesel cars. They have lower running costs, saving money over time.

Electricity

Petrol and diesel cars are not environmentally friendly as they release carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas, which contributes to global warming. As a result of this we started using electrical fuels. This is a much more environmentally friendly way of creating and using energy. Electricity is the future of fuels and is already used globally.

Hydrogen

Henry Cavendish and Sir William Robert Grove were the inventors of Hydrogen fuel. Hydrogen is a cleaner source of energy that can be used to power vehicles, generate electricity and heat homes. Hydrogen fuel cars produce zero emissions, have higher energy efficiency, and allow for quick refuelling compared to petrol or diesel cars. Hydrogen can be produced from renewable sources like solar and wind at lower operational and maintenance costs.

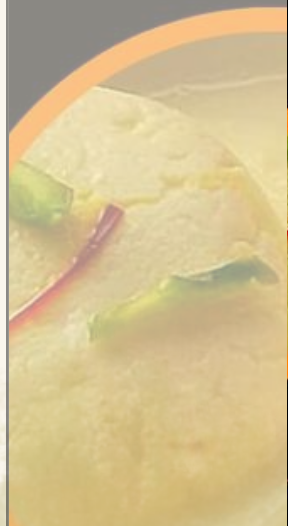
