Used Sailboat Inspection Checklist (Inspired by Don Casey)

PURPOSE: Use this to evaluate the *structure and systems* of an aging sailboat before falling in love. This is a **pre-survey checklist** to help you decide if it's worth pursuing further.

 1. First Impressions □ Does the boat <i>look</i> maintained or neglected overall? □ Any strong smells onboard? (mold, diesel, sewage, battery) □ Obvious damage or amateur repairs? □ Do the owner's answers feel honest and detailed?
 2. Hull and Topsides Any signs of blisters below the waterline? Cracks around through-hulls, rudder post, or chainplates? Is the gelcoat faded, crazed, or cracked? Tap around the hull and deck—does it sound solid or dull? Evidence of prior groundings or keel damage?
3. Deck and Core Integrity ☐ Walk barefoot—any soft or spongy areas? ☐ Check under winches, stanchions, cleats—solid or flexing? ☐ Deck hardware: secure or wobbly? ☐ Water stains or signs of leaks inside? ☐ Cockpit sole solid or cracking?
 4. Rigging and Mast □ Mast base: corroded or solid? □ Standing rigging: rust, kinks, or broken wires? □ Chainplates: cracked, leaking, or moving? □ Mast step (deck or keel stepped) free of corrosion? □ Age of rigging (if over 10 years, budget replacement)
 5. Keel and Rudder Keel bolts visible and clean inside? Cracks where keel meets hull? Rudder free of cracks or swelling? Steering moves smoothly and without slop? Any rust weeping from keel or rudder?

6. Engine and Propulsion ☐ Visible oil or fuel leaks? ☐ Engine mounts: rusted or loose? ☐ Belts, hoses, and clamps in good condition?
 □ Does it start cold? Any smoke or hard starts? □ Engine hours and service history available?
7. Electrical System ☐ Wiring tidy or messy? (Labelled? Same gauge?) ☐ Any corroded or melted wires? ☐ Battery box secure and vented? ☐ Are lights, pumps, and electronics working? ☐ Is there a fuse/breaker panel? Marked?
8. Plumbing and Tanks Water system pressure test (pump, faucet, leaks)? Condition of hoses (soft, brittle, cracked)? Freshwater tanks—plastic or metal? Any smell? Any evidence of leaks or water under the floorboards? Toilet (head) flushes and holds pressure? Smells?
9. Leaks and Moisture □ Check around all hatches, ports, and windows □ Any signs of mold or water damage below? □ Is the bilge dry or oily/wet? □ Musty smells or fresh airflow? □ Any sagging headliner or mold behind panels?
10. Interior Condition ☐ Clean, tidy, and well-maintained or neglected? ☐ Cushions dry and foam still good? ☐ Woodwork solid and not rotted? ☐ Sole (floor) feels firm, not soft or springy? ☐ Signs of DIY botched repairs?

Final Questions to Ask Yourself

☐ Can I handle the worst-case scenario on this boat?

 □ Would I still want it if I had to replace the engine and rig? □ How much time, money, and stress will it really cost me? □ Am I chasing a dream, or evaluating a boat? 	
Tip: Don't inspect to <i>justify</i> the boat—inspect to <i>disqualify</i> it. If it passes this checklist and still feels right, then you may have a worthy contender.	this
