Many remember his testimony. After gangs destroyed his church in Port-au-Prince and killed several leaders, he fled barefoot with his family, losing everything, even the small bakery that supported them.

Later, in Cap-Haitien (northern Haiti) God helped him rebuild his life. Nothing could stop his love for our Savior and his passion to preach the gospel to the lost in sickness and health.

Through help from Grace Baptist Church in South Dakota, Pastor Isaac restarted a small business and, most importantly, his ministry. He started a small business again to provide for his family, though much of his limited income later went toward medical expenses.

The Gospel Continues Forward

Please pray especially for Pastor Junot's ministry in Port Salut, Haiti. The believers are rebuilding their meeting place through sacrificial effort and your support. Despite hardship, the gospel continues to spread in the hills of Verdin. From late 2025 through February 2026, by God's grace, 29 people came to Christ, a reminder that even in unstable soil, by the power of the Holy Spirit, the Word bears fruit.

Haiti Today - Resistance, Not Yet Restoration

Many ask whether Haiti is improving. In some ways, yes but cautiously. New leadership, equipment, and international assistance have allowed authorities to push gangs back in certain areas, and police can once again enter some neighborhoods. This is real progress.

Yet stability has not returned. After operations end, many places fall again under gang control because institutions remain weak. Today, Haiti has moved from uncontrolled chaos to fragile containment, the beginning of resistance, not a return to normal life.

Kidnappings have increased again, and some kidnappers now wear police uniforms, creating fear and confusion among the population. Two of our churches in gang territories remain closed, and many believers have fled. Please continue to pray, hope is visible, but still tender.

Other Prayer Needs

1. The orphanage children and the nation of Haiti.
2. Churches affected by gang territories in Haiti.
3. Rebuilding efforts in Port Salut, Haiti.
4. The Tampa, Florida church seeking a larger meeting place.
5. **Our upcoming ministry trip to the Dominican Republic.** The church in the Dominican is in a season of trial, and Pastor Daniel urgently needs housing for himself, his wife Viviane, and their four children.
