Ministry Update

Friday Night Youth Ministry

We have so much to praise God for in our Friday Night Youth Ministry! The team has grown into a faithful group of 16 leaders, each one serving with passion and heart. Every Friday night, more than 80 youth fill the space with energy, laughter, and worship — and we continue to see lots of new faces each week.

Many of the teens who come don't attend church anywhere, yet they show up faithfully on Fridays. What an incredible opportunity to love them, share the gospel, and have fun doing it! We're seeing hearts open and lives changed as several have recently made decisions to trust Christ as their Savior.

We currently have 10 small groups, and it's been amazing to watch our youth leaders invest deeply in their kids — encouraging, praying with, and walking beside them in faith. Seeing those relationships grow has been one of the sweetest fruits of this season.

And here's a wonderful answered prayer: right before our September kickoff, Veronica and I were talking about how much we needed more male leaders. Not even five minutes later, two men came up to us and said they felt led to join the youth team! We just laughed and thanked God — He is so faithful to provide exactly what's needed, right on time.



Discipleship

One of the greatest joys of teaching at the school and leading youth group has been the opportunity to build deep, lasting relationships with so many students. Even after they graduate, many continue to stay connected — they come over, call, or reach out for encouragement and godly advice. It's a powerful thing to be one of the first phone calls a young person makes after walking through something painful — like losing a parent. Our home is often full of teens just hanging out, laughing, and being themselves. But even in those casual moments, God gives us opportunities to share His love and truth.

As a team, we are currently discipling seven students, and it's been such a blessing to watch them grow in their faith. In the busyness of ministry, God has also placed a burden on our hearts for discipleship within our own family. None of our boys have been formally discipled by someone outside our home, so we sat down to talk with them about it. Their response blessed us deeply: "You already disciple us every day." We realized they were right — through our family devotions, daily prayer, and constant conversations about faith, life, and God's Word, discipleship is happening right in our home. What a reminder of God's grace in the middle of the everyday moments!

Recently, our national pastor, Carlos Rijos, shared a message that deeply resonated with us. He asked, "What do you purposefully teach your kids? You teach them education is important; you teach them to strive for excellence — but do you teach them about Christ? Do you teach them godly values?"

As teachers and missionaries, we pour into so many others, but that message reminded us how vital it is to stay intentional with our own children — to make sure we don't lose sight of our first ministry: our family.

Salvations and Baptisms

Mission work is not always easy—there are long days, hard conversations, and moments that stretch our faith—but it is so worthwhile in light of eternity. We are reminded of that truth every time a young person chooses to follow Jesus as their Lord and Savior.
