From My Ministries:

Dear Friends and Ministry Partners,

I hope this letter finds you well. First, I want to thank you from the bottom of my heart for your continued support—both prayerfully and financially. Your faithfulness means more than I can express, and I'm deeply grateful for the role you play in the work God is doing here. I also want to sincerely apologize for how long it has been since my last update. These past six months have been full of transition and growth, and I regret not keeping you more consistently informed. Thank you for your patience and grace.

One major update is that I have changed the church in which I serve. The previous church now has several youth who are able to serve by playing piano, which freed me up to pursue

ministry in a church closer to where I live—just 10 minutes away instead of 25. The new church is John 3:16 Christian Baptist Church. This has already provided more consistent opportunities to build relationships within the Dominican community and step into more direct discipleship roles.

In addition, I want to give a huge praise report: a tremendously generous donor recently paid the remainder of the loan I had with the mission office. I'm overwhelmed with gratitude! Every single person who contributed to that debt being cleared—THANK YOU. Your generosity and obedience have lifted a major burden and allowed me to focus more fully on ministry.

Another recent highlight was attending a missionary conference. It was exactly what I

needed to recharge, reflect, and realign my heart for the remainder of the school year. That time of refreshment was such a gift and helped me return ready to pour out again with joy and energy.

Next week is our last week of school, and we'll be celebrating our high school graduates. Would you please join me in praying for them, and for all of our students, as they head into summer? Pray for protection, for continued spiritual growth, and for hearts to remain tender toward the Lord. Whether or not we see them again, we trust that God's Word does not return void.

Please continue to pray for my residency process, as I've hit a snag, and as such will be staying in the DR for most of the summer.

From My Heart:

Although the loan with the mission office has been fully paid—a tremendous blessing—I'm not entirely debt-free. I continue doing my best to faithfully meet my obligations while trusting that the Lord will provide above and beyond, as He has so many times before. My prayer is that, as these debts are paid off, more of my resources can be poured directly into ministry

and the people I serve. I

n addition to ongoing needs, I've also begun praying and planning for some future expenses. My vehicle, while still running, is definitely closer to the end of its life than the beginning. I know a replacement will eventually be necessary, and I'm asking the Lord to help me prepare wisely and pa-

tiently for that need. Power outages are also a regular part of life here, and while I'm incredibly thankful to have an inverter, the batteries it depends on are in need of replacement. Through it all, I'm trusting God's timing and provision—and asking for continued grace to wait well and steward faithfully.
