Dear Coworkers in Christ,

I was recently asked why I don't retire as a missionary since I can no longer live and work in Honduras on a full time basis. Some of you may be wondering the same thing. I will do my best to share my heart with you.

*First* of all, that's who I am! I AM a missionary! No matter where I happen to be, I am in a mission field with people who need to be reached with the Gospel and the love of Christ. And that is what I try to do - wherever I am! I can't retire from God's call upon my life!!

*Secondly*, most of the support that I receive from you is supporting the work and supplying the needs of the ministries in Honduras - and other missionaries around the world, as well as Bible printing ministries and Bible distribution to other countries.

*Thirdly*, I am in constant communication with so many in Honduras... pastors, church members and so many of my "kids" and their kids. I try to encourage them and they encourage me. I cannot tell you how many precious messages and calls I got for Mother's Day from my Honduran "family"!

I may not physically be in Honduras full time, but my thoughts, prayers and heart will continually and always be there. Your ongoing financial and prayer support not only helps with my physical needs, but most importantly, it sustains the ministry. As I said, the majority of the support that I get goes to missions, missionaries and world wide ministries. (The verse at the top of this letter is my prayer!)

God continues to bless the "seeds" that were sown while we were there in Honduras! In our town of La Esperanza and in the mountain communities of the Lenca Indians, God has blessed those works with faithful pastors and people who love the Lord and they are doing their best to reach the lost, even in new areas!

Bro. Hotir, the pastor at New Hope Baptist in La Esperanza, often makes the 4-6 hr. trip to Danli, where my son, Brandon Lane, is in charge of the Christian conference center that is being built there. Hotir has done MUCH of the electrical work and is a tremendous help to my son. They are trying to finish up some of the new construction before the National Pastors' Conference that will be held July 20-23. And at that time, Hotir will be driving a group of pastors from our works to the conference. This conference is SUCH a help, blessing and encouragement to these men of God. Please uphold them in your prayers.

I ask that you also please continue to pray for the health of Hotir's wife, Marta. Because of your prayers, she is doing better. But she still needs our prayers.

Thank you again for your faithfulness and love! May God greatly bless you as only He can!
