On August 23rd of the 125 students across fourteen countries, thirteen received their bachelor's degrees in Bright Spot Baptist's auditorium. They are Seminario Bautista Logos' first generation of graduates. Six are pastors that minister in five countries.

For six years I taught seminary courses in two Hispanic churches. Pastor Fernando Gallardo said being able to receive formal seminary studies answered his prayer of twenty years. The classes were the seed that



resulted in Fernando Montt's vision for Seminario Bautista Logos.

Fernando and Gisela Montt left the country as their permanent visas are approved. He will visit churches in Latin America to increase the seminary's enrollment. Pray God prospers his vision and for an increase in financial support so more students can receive scholarships. Our expenses are low as every staff member serves on a voluntary basis.

Having a national pastor is a significant factor in the establishment of an indigenous church. When a seminary graduate plants a church, it is national at inception. His ministry does the work of a missionary.

The Bible institute that I began in La Esperanza, Honduras, continues under Pastor Edy Poz and Saúl Sánchez. They have sixty-five students representing forty churches in seven countries.

Seven students in Peru finished my Missiology course. Because of my fifty-seven years of experience, they asked me to teach Pastoral

Theology. Raymundo Zacal requested I teach a course in Ushuaía, Argentina.

The congregation in Carrisal has begun to hold services in their new building. The constitent

sowing by the team from Reparto will soon result in converts and a growing attendance in that community.

Two men will be ordained on September 13 in Santa Catarina, Honduras. Before we had pastors, I believed that in the future missionaries would not be needed in the presbyteries. God honors my faith.

The trip to Honduras, planned by Michael Price, was cancelled because of a lack of interest. Pray for him as he begins Bible college. Also continue to pray for our pastor, Bobby Helms, who has been incapacitated for five months due to pancriatis. Thankfully, the Holy Spirit contines to bless the church with conversions and growth.
