## THE MARINE SECURITY GUARD PROGRAM

The close relationship between the Department of State and the U.S. Marine Corps is almost as old as the United States itself. Marines have served in Nicaragua, Korea, Cuba, Haiti, China, Dominican Republic, Mexico and 'in every clime and place' at the request of several Secretaries of State.

Shortly after World War II, it was felt that a young, alert, and disciplined force was needed to protect American Embassies, Consulates and Legations throughout the World. The Marine Corps was chosen to provide this protection, thus renewing our historic ties.

The Marine Security Guard Program came into being in 1949, when the first six Marines arrived in Bangkok. However, it was not until November, 1954, that the Marine Security Guard School commenced its formal training program. With the emergence of new nations in Africa and Asia, Marines serve in many new and unusual places. Today, approximately one thousand Marines serve in ninety-eight foreign service posts in ninety countries. The State/Marine team will continue in their cooperative effort to best serve the interests of the United States abroad.

Qualified volunteers for this special foreign duty are recommended by their commanding officers and ordered to the Marine Security Guard School for six weeks of joint training. After thorough screening, successful candidates are issued dress uniforms and civilian clothing and are ordered abroad. The normal tour of duty in the program is two years.

The continual reference to 'My Marines' by the numerous Chiefs of Missions is ever gratifying, as is the splendid reputation of all Marines associated with this duty. This esteem which Marines enjoy has been earned by the outstanding performance of duty in accomplishing their important mission for the United States.
