In 2024, our youth had the opportunity to experience a wide range of activities designed for education, expanding their horizons, and exposing them to new, exciting opportunities:



We were able to take the 10U team to the Aquarium. For the majority of the youth it was their first time ever getting to experience the Tennessee Aquarium!



The 16U team took a tour of Chattanooga State Community College. They were able to see the campus, learn about the different programs that are offered, and even had a chance to sit down with the baseball coach and ask questions about the program. The coach said that he was very impressed with how engaged the youth were, and the good questions that they asked.



In partnership with the Chattanooga Audubon Society, we were able to take the 13U team on a kayaking trip on the Tennessee River. It was all of the youth's first time kayaking! We paddled from the walking bridge to Maclellan Island and got to see the goats that were brought onto the island to eat the invasive plant species. The kids had a great time on the water!



The SYD teams were able to attend 2 professional baseball games including a minor league game at the Chattanooga Lookouts and an MLB game at the Atlanta Braves! Thank you to both the Lookouts and the Braves for donating tickets!








MENTORSHIP & CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT
