HEALTHY KIDS CLINIC HELPED US IN SO MANY WAYS

"My family moved to the US at the end of 2013 with my mother and 2 younger siblings. When we tried to go to school we had to get vaccines and assessments because we had no record here or a way to recover the ones back home. We were "illegal" at the time even though we entered with a permit from immigration. But we had zero benefits like health insurance. This is where the Healthy Kids Clinic came in and helped us in so many ways. Doing routine checks, giving vaccinations, providing medications that my siblings and I needed every time we got sick. We got all the assessments and vaccinations needed at Healthy Kids Clinic to start going to school. We even got dental care which was very much needed but due to our financial and immigration situation we were not able to get if not through Healthy Kids Clinic. This clinic made a big impact in my life and (on) my whole family. We did not know our rights and had no other professional help or care at the time when we were going through so much at home. I am so thankful that God has blessed me and my family (through) everyone who works (with) and supports this clinic."

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DENTAL CARE—ALWAYS A CHALLENGE

Over the years, dental care has been one of the largest single budget item for the Healthy Kids School-based Health Clinics. Even with the student discount from the University of Iowa Dental College, the cost has impacted the operating budget of the Clinics.

Dr. Art Nowak, D.D.S., came to our rescue in 2016 by volunteering his time one day per week providing dental evaluations, fillings, fluoride treatments, and other basic dental care to children served in the Healthy Kids School-based Health Clinics. Dr. Nowak saw children in the Iowa City Free Medical and Dental Clinic. The Free Medical and Dental Clinic provided a dental assistant hired with grant funds from the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry Foundation. The Johnson County Health Department also provides in-kind dental services by their Dental Hygienist, but their funding has been cut drastically. Dr. Nowak is retiring from this volunteer position and we are in the process of recruiting other dentists to fill the gap.



YOUR DOLLARS AT WORK-BRINGING YOU UP TO DATE

Donations to the Clinics are used for current operations and to sustain our services going forward, including medications, supplies, equipment and Clinic Coordinator time. Physician services are generously provided by the University of Hospitals and Clinics at no cost to us.

The Clinics started in the 2007-08 school year, offering appointments 4 hours per week at one school. Thanks to your donations, during the 2022-23 school year we will schedule appointments 14-20 hours per week at 4 schools. These schools are **South East Jr. High**, **Northwest Jr. High**, **City High**, and **West High**. Any child from birth through high school graduation living in Johnson or Washington Counties who are uninsured, underinsured, or experience extreme barriers to accessing healthcare is eligible for our services. Many of our patients are newcomers from another state or a foreign county. When children come to Iowa from another state, it takes several months to get active insurance. When children come from another country, they are often not eligible for public insurance for many months or even years. In the meantime, parents have peace of mind knowing their children can access healthcare through the Healthy Kids School-Based Health Clinics.

Clinic Services:

- Well child exam-with recommended developmental, mental health and vision screenings, dental fluoride application
- Sick visits
- Management of chronic medical problems, such as asthma, spina bifida, epilepsy, learning problems, depression and more
- Vision, mental health and other specialty care referrals

In 2021-22, the Clinics

- cared for 391 patients
- completed 895 medical appointments
- provided 103 child psychiatry appointments
- provided 189 dental appointments
- administered 275 Covid vaccines
- administered 1371 routine vaccines

Over the years the District has provided clinic space and renovations, utilities and administrative support. District staff including the School Nurses, Student & Family Advocates, Athletic Trainers, and Teachers make referrals to the Clinics and help with ongoing follow-up and care.

"For 15 years the Healthy Kids School-Based Health Clinics have provided medical, mental health, dental and vision services to students in our district who struggle to find healthcare.
