PROGRAMS OF STUDY

PGU consists of a highly informative program that offers students education from an Associate's to the Doctoral level. Our goal is to provide the believer a context for academic preparation balanced with passion-infused spiritual formation.

PGU offers biblical and spiritual preparation to men and women dedicated to the ministry, either vocationally or of any nature. Our aim is to equip leaders to become agents of change for the Kingdom of God, cultivate intimacy with Him, and release God's supernatural power wherever they go.

CREDIT HOURS

PGU's courses of study are divided into quarters. Our quarters are divided into ten (10) week periods. Students earn two (2) credit hours for each ten (10) week course that they complete. One credit hour is the equivalent of 15 one-hour class sessions. Students are also required to be involved in six (6) hours of practical ministry experience per week which is equivalent to four (4) credit hours per ten (10) week period / quarter they complete.

GENERAL ADMISSIONS & REGISTRATION

Power of God University is an equal opportunity Christian educational institution which admits qualified applicants regardless of gender, ethnic group, age, handicap status, or veteran status. A qualified applicant is described as a person who meets the following general admissions requirements along with the specific requirements for the program that he/she will pursue. Each applicant must meet the general admissions requirements as follows:

- At least 18 years of age.
- Complete PGU application.
- Submit a recent passport type photo for identification purposes with the completed application.
- Submit high school transcripts (A high school diploma or equivalent is required for enrollment into PGU's degree program).
- If requested, present evidence of good physical and mental health.
- If requested, submit a physical examination report including immunizations and drug screening.
- Have adequate means of paying his/her tuition and fees as PGU does not offer financial aid, grants or student loans at this time.
- Properly complete all required admissions paperwork.
- Attend the student orientation.
- Progression is dependent on maintaining a 2.0 GPA or better in all courses.

ATTENDANCE

To ensure the best possible result from the PGU program, students are encouraged to attend all class sessions for the courses in which they are enrolled. If an absence is unavoidable, it is the student's responsibility to contact the PGU office.

Excessive absences may adversely affect the student's grade and may possibly lead to failure of the course.

Students are allowed three (3) unexcused absences before any action is taken. If a student is absent for three (3) consecutive days, a written excuse is required. Any student absent for five (5) consecutive days is subject to automatic withdrawal by the college.

It is the responsibility of the student to complete all course work assigned during the period of his/her absence.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Every student enrolled in *PGU* is required to be part of **practical ministries**. Every campus has different opportunities for the student to commit to various outreach ministries and accumulate his weekly hours.

In a similar manner, every student must attend **prayer meetings** in the host church. In this time he will worship with the congregation and pray for the manifestation of the power of God in the Church and in the nations of the world.

Every student will spend approximately 10 hours in his **homework** every week with work related to the theological courses, but that number is expected to rise as students go to more advanced modules (from Associate level to Post-Graduate.)

Every student will journal and write at least one chapter every week. This journal will form part of the dynamic of cultivating a relationship with God in a **secret place**. Every student is invited to spend close to 5 hours every week in the place of prayer, but our desire is that this will genuinely flow from the student's heart.

During his studies every student will be required to attend a **church service** and also be part of a **discipleship group** with more students to grow in fellowship with other believers and be discipled by the group leader, who will be part of the *PGU* faculty.

Lastly, it is required that every student of the *Power of God University* must spend roughly 10 weeks of missionary work in national or international locations in the course of one year of studies. The University, *Nidia Meneses Ministry*, and the host congregations organize mission trips frequently, in which students can participate. The locations may be national or even international, accumulating the 10 weeks in one, two, three or more trips.

The academic calendar varies from campus to campus. Therefore, throughout the year students are constantly starting their studies and graduating from them in the *Power of God University*.

CURRICULUM

PGU is designed to award each student according to his or her efforts. We offer a certificate of achievement, a diploma, an associate degree, a bachelor degree, a master degree, and a doctorate degree to each one who successfully completes the specified curriculum with a Grade Point Average not less than 2.0.

DIPLOMAS AND CERTIFICATES

Diplomas and certificates of achievement may be awarded to students who successfully complete specific courses of study and are not pursuing a degree.

DEGREES

Associate of Theology and Pastoral Ministry (60 credits)

Focus: a general introduction to biblical theology and ministry.

The Associate's program in theology offers a means to acquire solid and accessible theological education. The students who complete this program receive a general introduction to biblical theology and the various disciplines of practical ministry. We invite every student who senses a call to the ministry to continue his or her education to at least at a Bachelor's level.

Bachelor of Theology and Pastoral Ministry (122 credits)

Focus: a formative introduction to biblical theology and ministry. The Bachelor's program in theology comprises a formal education curriculum that seeks to take the student to deepen study, analyze, and become an autonomous theological thinker.

In addition to an introduction to biblical theology and ministry, the students are trained to be capable to assume a role of leadership in the local church, in the preaching, teaching, evangelism, and discipleship ministries. Prerequisite: Successfully complete Associate of Theology program.

Master of Theology and Pastoral Ministry

Basic information in Thesis Writing

Description: A training program in theology, at the master's level, is part of a formal education process, which seeks the student to deepen, analyze and construct an autonomous theological knowledge that reflects his mastery of this discipline and enables him to research and teach it.

The Master in Theology is a graduate level program that can be achieved in our institution, and therefore, to access this level, the student must give evidence of the knowledge he already has in the biblical, historical, and pastoral areas, and particularly Theological.

Doctor of Theology and Pastoral Ministry

Basic information in Thesis Writing

Description: A theology training program, at the doctoral level, is the culmination of a formal education process, which seeks for the student to deepen, analyze and construct an autonomous theological knowledge that reflects his mastery of this discipline and enables him to research and teach it.

The doctorate in theology is the highest level that can be reached in our institution, and therefore, to access this level, the student must give evidence of the knowledge he already has in the biblical, historical, pastoral, but particularly theological areas. It is a program of doctoral level studies oriented to the research and development of 25 theses whose objective is to provide a contribution in a specific field of theology.

COURSE CATALOG

(Each Course of study represents two credit-hours)

Course Name, Number, & Content

ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAM

Abundant Life AL-140

In this course the student will explore what the Bible says about the benefits as well as the responsibilities to living a life of obedience to Christ.

Bible Overview BO-140

This course gives an excellent grounding in an overall knowledge and understanding of all the books of the Bible and how they fit together to give us the broad picture of God's plan for mankind.

The Life of Christ I LC-141

This course is a study on the life of Christ during His childhood years based on Matthew's Gospel.

The Life of Christ II LC-142

The intent of this study is to analyze the first year of ministry of Jesus, to understand the context of his teachings as well as His techniques.

The Life of Christ III LC-143

Analyses the second year of the ministry of Jesus and describes Galilee and the expansion of the kingdom of that province. Also shows students how to compare related episodes in various Gospels and how to confront apparent contradictions in them.

The Life of Christ IV LC-144

Analyses the third year of the ministry of Jesus (Year of Passion). Deals with the doctrine of man, sin, death, correct and false concepts about the human body and the spirit. Also shows the basic principles of pastoral psychology.

The Life of Christ V LC-145

This course focuses on the events and teachings of the last week of Jesus' life. Introduces the use of the evaluation technique and finishes with a comparative analysis of the life of Christ in the four Gospels.

The Life of Christ VI LC-146

This course focuses on the last chapter of the Gospel of Matthew as well as the Acts of the Apostles. It deals with Christ's Resurrection and its proofs, the Ascension, the Great Commission and how this was put into practice by the early church.

Book of Ephesians EPH-140

This is a study on practical and devotional lessons from the letter of Paul to the Ephesians. The aim of the course is to teach the student to see things from God's point of view, to make profound changes in his life and daily conduct.

The Spirit World SW-140

The intent of this study is to help the student understand how to deal with the daily spiritual battles with Satan and counseling those who have had contact with the occult and other harmful practices of the spirit world.

The Pentateuch I PT-241

The intent of this study is to cover the development of the first book in the Bible – Genesis. It focuses on Abraham, his family, and the lineage of the Messiah.

The Pentateuch II PT-242

This study presents the unity of Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy – the four remaining books of the Pentateuch.

The Pauline Epistles I PE-241

This study gives in detail the life of the apostle Paul from childhood to the end of his first missionary journey. It focuses on his Letter to the Galatians encompassing Justification by Faith, Law and Grace, Redemption, Heirs and Sons, Union, Pastoral care, the Apostleship of Paul, the Fruit of the Spirit and its pastoral application.

The Pauline Epistles II PE-242

Covers the events of the second missionary journey of the Apostle Paul and provides Bible studies of the main themes of 1 and 2 Thessalonians and Philippians.

The Pauline Epistles III PE-243

Focuses on Paul's third missionary journey, his imprisonment and death and contains Bible studies on selected topics in his letters to the Ephesians, Colossians, Philemon, Corinthians and Romans.

Bible Encounter BE-340

This is a course and important aid for leaders of Bible Study Groups as a means of evangelism and discipleship. The student will learn how to train groups on different themes such as evangelization, doctrine, personal relationships, emotional problems, and spiritual matters.

Children's Ministry CM-340

This specialized course has been designed as an effective training for those who are called and have the vocation to evangelize and disciple children. It includes practical training for Children's Church or Sunday School teachers.

The Ministry of the Holy Spirit HS-340

The purpose of this course is to give the student an understanding of Who the Holy Spirit is, His purpose, and His work in the life of the believer.

How To Preach HP-340

The purpose of this course is to introduce and to train Christian workers in the basic principles of hermeneutics and homiletics.

Preparing & Leading Services PLS-340

A theoretical and practical course which shows the student how to prepare and lead lively, ordered and Biblical congregational worship.

Jeremiah I JER-341

The intent of this study is to cover the complete text of the book of Jeremiah in historical order as well as look at the topics associated with the teachings within the texts.

Jeremiah II JER-342

After successfully completing this course, the student will be able to build up a sequence of summaries outlining the principle points of the Book of Jeremiah in their approximate chronological order as well as have a good grasp of the teaching points and how to apply them to our situation today.

Practical Ministry Experience I PR-441

Students are required to be involved in at least 6 hours of practical ministry experience every week. Ministry experience will include participation as well as leadership roles in evangelistic outreaches, local church services, discipleship groups, and prayer meetings. In addition to the weekly hours of practical ministry experience, students are to spend roughly 10 weeks of missionary work in national or international locations in the course of one year of studies.

BACHELOR DEGREE PROGRAM

(Prerequisite: Successfully complete Associate Degree level)

Introduction to Hebrew HEB-440

This course has been carefully designed so that the student gently studies the basic principles of the language whilst studying the Hebrew text of Genesis chapters 1 and 2. The student will become familiar with the Hebrew letters, text, pronunciation and basic grammar.

Kingdom Living KL-340

This course concerns the Kingdom of God. It introduces the two spiritual kingdoms, their rulers, and residents. It provides spiritual keys for gaining access to the Kingdom of God and warns of things which result in being cast out of the Kingdom. The past, present, and future of this Kingdom are examined, Kingdom parables are explained, and its patterns and principles of living are stressed.

Financial Freedom I FF-441

This study gives a Biblical overview of how God prospers his people and desires to give them financial freedom through principles of sowing and reaping and the obedience of His word.

Financial Freedom II FF-442

This study gives a Biblical overview of how God prospers his people and desires to give them financial freedom through principles of sowing and reaping and the obedience of His word. This is a continuation of Financial Freedom I but is more in depth.

Mercy Missions Training MM-440

This course helps the student to correctly understand the Gospel and the importance of proclamation by word and deed. The student will learn how to organize and carry out mercy projects as part of their evangelistic effort.

Working For God WG-340

The purpose of this study is to set out the Biblical and ethical principles for work. It shows how work is a blessing from God and teaches how to do it to honor the Creator and serve others.

Community Health CH-340

This course deals with the biblical concern for the sick and needy and, above all, with the matchless example of the compassion Jesus Christ showed/had as he tirelessly sought to alleviate their suffering. Students will receive practical training in educating impoverished communities in the area of health, hygiene, and safety.

Old Testament I OT-441

This course is a general overview of all 39 Old Testament books. By the end of this study, students will be able to confidently communicate each of the Old Testament books, as well as have a better understanding of God's plan of redemption from Creation to Christ.

Old Testament II OT-442

The emphasis of this course changes from a general overview to a chronological study. The student will go through the entire Old Testament highlighting the major events in the order that they happened. By the end of this study, students will be able to confidently communicate each of the Old Testament books, as well as have a better understanding of God's plan of redemption from Creation to Christ.

New Testament Gospels NTG-441

Students will go through all four Gospels highlighting the purpose, themes, and 208 key events/teachings of the life and ministry of Jesus. By the end of this study, students will be able to confidently communicate from each of the four Gospels.

New Testament Pastoral Epistles NTE-442

Students will cover Paul's letters to Timothy and Titus focusing on strong leadership and defending/maintaining sound doctrine, even in times of persecution. By the end of this study, the student will be prepared to teach the Word of God in season or out of season.

New Testament General Letters NTL-443

This course covers all of the remaining books in the New Testament from Romans to Revelation. The emphasis of this book is to systematically cover the New Testament letters from the apostles to the different individuals and churches. The focus will be on the major concepts and key words of the New Testament General Letters.

Bible Doctrines BD-440

This systematic study covers the major doctrines of the Bible. The focus will be on eleven doctrines that cover the essential topics of theology. By the end of this course, the student will have covered the major doctrines of the Bible and have a clear picture of who God is and what God is doing in our world to glorify Himself.

Biblical Theology BT-440

The purpose of this study is to provide a summary for independent learning and/or teaching of basic theological concepts. It uses the Scriptures as the primary resource. It includes the study of Paterology, Christology, Pneumatology, Angelology, Demonology, Bibliology, Harmartiology, Soteriology, Ecclesiology, and Eschatology.

Apologetics AP-440

The purpose of this course is to give the student a clear and strong defense of the faith, a better understanding of the history of Christianity through the ages, as well as confidence to face spiritual warfare in the authority of Jesus Christ. This study will also include a survey of 22 different world religions and cults.

Christianity Explained CE-440

An evangelistic course designed to train people in a practical way to reach their community for Christ. The student will learn how to effectively share the Gospel in different public and one-on-one settings.

Hermeneutics HER-440

In this course the student will learn how to study and interpret the Bible correctly. The goal of this study is for the students to be able to confidently hear and/or read what the Scripture says, determine what it means, and how it should be obeyed and applied.

Homiletics HOM-440

The intent of this course is to train the student how to teach and preach the Word of God. By the end of this course, the student will be able to confidently communicate the Word of God on a daily basis to those in their home, neighborhood, workplace, and community.

Church Planting CP-440

The emphasis of this course is to learn biblical principles of church planting as seen in the early church. By the end of this course, the student will be able to confidently evangelize and disciple new believers, as well as have a good understanding of how the Church formed and spread in the Book of Acts.

Disciples Training Disciples DT-440

The purpose of this training course is to equip disciples to be able to make disciples. Participants will be equipped to share their faith with others and teach them to be a faithful follower of Jesus Christ.

Evangelism EV-440

This course is an in-depth training on effectively impacting a community with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Included in this study is how to effectively conduct mass evangelism campaigns as well as church planting methods.

Strategies for Spiritual Harvest STR-440

PROGRAMS OF STUDY

PGU consists of a highly informative catalogue of programs that offers students education from an Associate's to the Doctoral level. Our goal is to provide the believer a context for academic preparation balanced with passion-infused spiritual formation.

CREDIT HOURS

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Every student enrolled in *PGU* is required to be part of **practical ministries**. Every campus has different opportunities for the student to commit to various outreach ministries and accumulate his weekly hours. In a similar manner, every student must attend **prayer meetings** in the host church. In this time he will worship with the congregation and pray for the manifestation of the power of God in the Church and in the nations of the world.

Every student will spend approximately 10 hours in his **homework** every week with work related to the theological courses, but that number is expected to rise as students go to more advanced modules (from Associate level to Post-Graduate.)

Every student will journal and write at least one chapter every week. This journal will form part of the dynamic of cultivating relationship with God in the **secret place**. Every student is invited to spend close to 5 hours every week in the place of prayer, but our desire is that this will genuinely flow from the student's heart.

During his studies every student will be required to attend a **church service** and also be part of a **discipleship group** with more students to grow in fellowship with other believers and be discipled by the group leader, who will be part of the *PGU* faculty.

Lastly, it is required that every student of the *Power of God University* must spend roughly 10 weeks of missionary work in national or international locations in the course of one year of studies. The University, *Nidia Meneses Ministry*, and the host congregations organize mission trips frequently, in which students can participate. The locations may be national or even international, accumulating the 10 weeks in one, two, three or more trips.

The academic calendar varies from campus to campus. Therefore, throughout the year students are constantly starting their studies and graduating from them in the *Power of God University*.

CURRICULUM

PGU is designed to award each student according to his or her efforts. We offer a certificate of achievement, a diploma, an associate degree, a bachelor degree, a master degree, and a doctorate degree to each one who successfully completes the specified curriculum with a Grade Point Average not less than 2.0.

DIPLOMAS AND CERTIFICATES

CERTIFICATES

Worship Ministry Certificate

STATEMENT OF FAITH

1. The Word of God
