

PREDICTABLE TEXT FLUENCY

Lesson Focus and Goals:

Begin to build confidence in reading through the use of predictable texts.

Use texts with pictures that help them guess the words.

Find books that are very repetitive so that they can predict what the words say.

Materials Recommended:

Predictable books!

You can use books from home or go to the library.

Important Notes/Tricks:

We are trying to build confidence and make reading fun. Don't worry if they are making up the words and not getting them all correct.

Activities and Lessons Included:

- There are two predictable texts I created attached. Read the text aloud to your child first. After you read it aloud, have them read it chorally with you (both of you read at the same time), finally have them read it on their own.
- I recommend repeating this activity with predictable books (not just the worksheets).

Predictable book suggestions (you can get from the library or find an online recording)

- Five Little Monkeys (Eileen Christelow)
- The Very Hungry Caterpillar (Eric Carle)




This is a red dog.
