### **MISSION**

We provide trade school education, job skills training, transportation, essential resources, certifications, and job placement into American companies. We give hope to individuals, especially in the high-risk population where suicide is at an all-time high.

#### THE CHALLENGE


In 2022 alone, the United States recorded over **49,000 suicides** — the highest number ever reported. The majority of these suicides were contributed to **financial hardships**, lack of **self-belonging**, and a feeling as a **burden** to their family and loved ones.


Every day, 135 Americans take their own lives.

1848 provides the tools and hope needed to prevent another suicide.

#### THE SOLUTION

**1848** has already begun to directly address this epidemic of despair by **restoring purpose**, **belonging**, **and identity** to roughly 4,000 individuals over the past 24 months.







America's Family is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit dedicated to rebuilding lives through purpose-driven education in trades, leveraging AI technology.

Our flagship initiative, 1848, was created to meet the growing national crisis across all the trades. 400,000 skilled positions go unfilled each month across America. 1848 will fill this void, while simultaneously giving hope and opportunity to thousands who, due to life setbacks, struggle to see or obtain their potential.

Through 1848, and one of its anchor programs Kilroy's Family Workshops, we provide training, mentorship, and career pathways that connect individuals to various industries throughout the U.S. economy.

### BY AMERICA'S FAMILY

1848 is a community-based training and empowerment hub being developed in McKinney, Texas. Designed as both a trade-skills campus and a model for replication nationwide. 1848 brings together education, AI technology, and industry collaboration to give back hope through purpose-driven work and future-proof careers.

At the heart of 1848 are Kilroy's Family Workshops — hands-on trade schools currently operating in Littleton, CO, and McKinney, TX.

**Kilroy's Family Workshop's provide** blacksmithing, welding, machining, 3D printing, and leatherwork training for ages 9 through adult. Its learn-by-doing approach fosters confidence, craftsmanship, and belonging, restoring dignity through skill and mentorship.


- 1,328 total welding students trained across all campuses
- 65% male and 35% female participation
- 78% of students receive partial financial assistance
- Majority age group: 20–34 years old



### STORIES OF IMPACT

- Keira found belonging and confidence after years of struggling to find identity.
- Zachary turned personal pain into mentorship, helping others find a second chance.
- Kade, once suicidal, found purpose, love, and a future through the Kilroy's community.

#### ZACHARY

Today, I am not just surviving,
I am helping others find a second
chance. I was born in China, but
by the grace of God, I was saved
from the orphanage in China.

I've had seven surgeries, and I was bullied a lot. And at one point, I had lost all hope and decided to take my own life.

But then God stepped in and gave me a second chance. That moment changed me forever. And when I see students struggling, I feel their pain because I've lived it. I'm able to share with them my stories and give them a second look at life.

That is why 1848 matters to me so much, because people like me can find hope, community, and truly start again.




#### KEIRA

I struggled a lot with discovering who I am. It's incredibly difficult not knowing who you are.

Coming here made it easier.

I finally had a place outside of my home that was safe, that had a great community. You get to make friends here that genuinely just care about you and your well-being. I also understand the struggle of adoption. I struggled with that for quite a while. But coming here has patched up everything, there's people who help you, and you feel safe, and just comfortable and better, you belong.



KADE

When I first started coming to Kilroy's, we were driving two hours both ways to get there and then back home. I was very suicidal at the time.

My friend had killed himself when we were young, and it left me in a pretty dark place. I wasn't okay.

But after starting to go to Kilroy's, I found direction, I found purpose. After going there for a while, things started to feel okay.

I found my lovely wife at Kilroy's. We are building a beautiful family and, there is hope for my future now.

### WHAT WE ARE BUILDING

Our Primary Goal: Create a scalable, sustainable model for trade education and community transformation through 1848 McKinney, anchored by Kilroy's Family Workshops.



### 2026 Objectives:

- 1. Complete physical site development for the 1848 McKinney campus on newly acquired property in McKinney, TX.
- 2. Launch expanded Kilroy's training programs serving an initial 150–200 students annually.
- 3. **Establish partnerships** with 10+ local employers and three regional trade schools.
- 4. **Develop and distribute** a replication plan for future 1848 sites in other regions and states.

### PROVEN RESULTS WE SEE

**Impact** is measured through tangible outcomes that demonstrate restored independence and stability:

- 96% of participants complete training and certification programs.
- 99% obtain gainful employment within 90 days of graduation.
- 93% report increased self-confidence, purpose, and community connection.
- 100+ families experience improved economic stability within the first year.

### BUILT TO LAST

America's Family and Kilroy's Family Workshops are designed for long-term impact to the communities they serve. Self-sustainability will be achieved through:

- Partnerships with trade schools, veteran organizations, and industry sponsors.
- A self-sustaining revenue stream via the 1848 Mercantile and future local retail businesses.
- Ongoing support from private donors and corporate partners through sponsorship programs.
