You’ll get the most out of this study by reading the **Scriptures in your own Bible** alongside this printed guide.

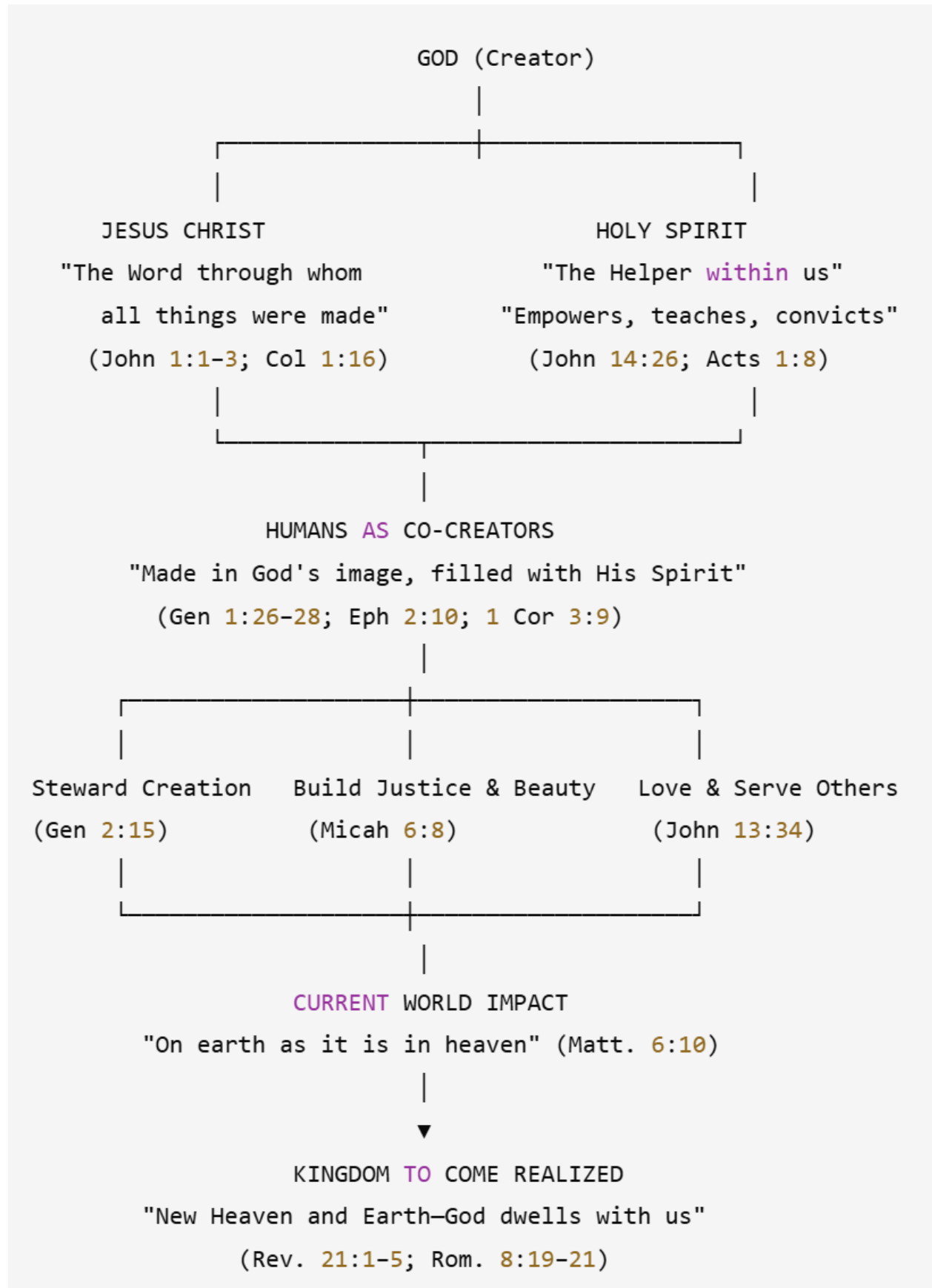
Bring your Bible, a notebook, and an open heart. God speaks through His Word.

Overview

Why are we here? What is our purpose as humans?

This study explores God’s original intent for humanity: **to reflect His image by creating, building, and stewarding the world with Him.**

We are not the ultimate Creator—**God alone creates out of nothing.** But as His image-bearers, we are invited to **co-create** with Him, using everything He has provided.

- The diagram places **God** as the Source, working through **Christ** and the **Holy Spirit**.
 - **Humans** partner with God by creating from what He has made—fulfilling a **kingdom role**.
 - Our actions in the present world directly contribute to preparing for the **Kingdom to come**.
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Part 1: Created in God's Image to Create

◆ Key Verse

"God created man in His own image... male and female He created them. And God blessed them. And God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion...'"

— *Genesis 1:27–28*

◆ What It Means to Be a Co-Creator

- **God creates from nothing** (*ex nihilo*) — Genesis 1:1
- **Humans create from what God has made** — Genesis 2:15, Exodus 31:3–5
- We are designed to **build culture, families, art, systems, and solutions**—in dependence on God.

"By wisdom the LORD laid the earth's foundations... through knowledge the depths were divided." — *Proverbs 3:19–20*

◆ Core Themes

- **Image-Bearing:** We reflect God by being creative, relational, and purposeful.

- **Resourcefulness:** God gives us materials, minds, and imagination.
 - **Responsibility:** Our creativity must reflect His goodness and wisdom.
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♦ **How Humans Co-Create**

God Creates	Humans Co-Create
Light from darkness	Lightbulbs, solar power
Trees	Furniture, homes, paper
Time	Schedules, rhythms, holidays
Breath of life	Music, poetry, languages
Matter	Art, tools, technology

We never create from nothing—but **everything we create reflects our Creator** when it honors Him.

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Part 2: Jesus—The Perfect Co-Creator and Restorer

“Through Him all things were made; without Him nothing was made that has been made.”

— John 1:3

“He is making all things new.” — Revelation 21:5

♦ Jesus and Creation

Jesus is not only Savior—He is **Creator and Sustainer**.

But He also entered creation as a human to **redeem and restore** it.

He worked with His hands. He told stories. He healed bodies. He multiplied food. He rebuilt lives.

“The Son is the radiance of God’s glory and the exact representation of His being, sustaining all things by His powerful word.” — Hebrews 1:3

♦ How Jesus Restores Our Creative Purpose

Through Christ:

- Our identity as co-creators is **restored**
- Our creativity is **redeemed** to serve good, not evil
- Our work becomes **worship** when aligned with His will

“Whatever you do... do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus.” — Colossians 3:17

The C.R.E.A.T.E. Framework

Use this to remember your purpose as a co-creator with God:

- **C – Called:** You are called by God to cultivate and create (Genesis 1:28).
 - **R – Resourced:** God gives you all you need—time, materials, abilities (2 Peter 1:3).
 - **E – Empowered:** The Holy Spirit fills you with wisdom and skill (Exodus 31:1–5).
 - **A – Accountable:** You steward what God entrusts (Matthew 25:14–30).
 - **T – Transformative:** Your work can reflect God’s goodness and bring healing.
 - **E – Eternal Impact:** What you do in Christ is never in vain (1 Corinthians 15:58).
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Creation, Culture, and the Kingdom

- **Culture:** Christians are called to influence culture through art, work, leadership, and innovation.
- **Stewardship:** Co-creating includes caring for the earth and its people.
- **The Church:** The body of Christ is meant to be a creative, renewing force in the world.

“We are God’s workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works...” — *Ephesians 2:10*

◆ Action Steps

1. 🛠️ Identify something you're building or creating in your life (e.g. a family, business, art, ministry).
2. 🙏 Invite God into that process: "Lord, help me create with You, not apart from You."
3. 💬 Share what you're creating with someone and ask for prayer and wisdom.
4. 📖 Read Genesis 1–2 and John 1 this week to reflect on God's creative heart.

🧩 Humans as Co-Creators — A Kingdom-Focused Chart

Human Role as Co-Creator	Kingdom of God Alignment	How It Reduces Suffering
🔨 Build & Create	"Your Kingdom come... on earth as it is in heaven." (<i>Matt. 6:10</i>)	Builds communities, homes, schools, and safe spaces
🌱 Steward & Care for Earth	"The earth is the Lord's... He entrusted it to man." (<i>Psalms 24:1, Gen. 2:15</i>)	Reduces environmental harm, food scarcity, and disease
🤝 Serve & Heal	"Whatever you did for the least... you did for Me." (<i>Matt. 25:40</i>)	Meets practical needs: hunger, illness, loneliness
🎨 Create Beauty & Culture	"He has made everything beautiful in its time." (<i>Eccl. 3:11</i>)	Lifts spirits, spreads hope, counters despair and chaos
⚖️ Promote Justice & Mercy	"Do justice, love mercy, walk humbly with God." (<i>Micah 6:8</i>)	Protects the vulnerable, confronts oppression
🗣️ Speak Truth & Share the Gospel	"Proclaim good news to the poor... freedom for captives." (<i>Luke 4:18</i>)	Breaks spiritual bondage, gives hope and identity
💡 Innovate & Solve Problems	"You gave him dominion... and crowned him with glory." (<i>Psalms 8:5–6</i>)	Provides solutions to poverty, health, and education
❤️ Build Loving Relationships	"Love one another as I have loved you." (<i>John 13:34</i>)	Heals emotional wounds, restores families and communities
🙏 Partner with God in Prayer	"The prayers of the righteous are powerful." (<i>James 5:16</i>)	Invites God's power into broken places and situations
