Test the Claims of Jesus Christ

If you're exploring the deeper questions of life—about truth, meaning, God, and the state of the world—you owe it to yourself to examine the claims of Jesus Christ. Not casually, not merely emotionally or religiously, but critically, philosophically, historically, and existentially.

What stands out about Jesus is that His claims don't ask you to suspend your reason.

They demand you *apply* it—deeper, more honestly than you ever have.

What should you investigate?

• Fulfilled Prophecies

— e.g., Isaiah 53, written centuries before Jesus' birth, describes His life and death in remarkable detail.

Gospel Consistency

— Four distinct accounts, written by different individuals, yet harmonizing on the essential character, teachings, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

Moral & Spiritual Teachings

— Teachings like the Sermon on the Mount reveal unmatched ethical clarity and spiritual depth.

• Transformational Impact

— Billions of lives transformed over centuries—across cultures, languages, and generations.

Scriptural Integrity

— The Bible's survival, unity, and influence are unparalleled in human history.

These aren't shallow religious slogans. They withstand scrutiny.

In fact—they invite it.

Understand Why We Often Resist Truth

Many people don't reject Jesus due to evidence.

They resist Him because of something deeper—inherited blindness or environmental conditioning.

What gets in the way?

- Pride
- Fear
- Shame
- Preconceptions
- Spiritual fatigue or trauma

The resistance may not be *intellectual*, but *spiritual*—rooted in identity, wounds, or a fear of what surrender really means.

Ask the Deeper Question

"Why do I think the way I think?"

This simple, brave question can open the door to genuine self-discovery.

Trace the sources of your beliefs:

- Genetic or emotional dispositions
- Family beliefs, culture, trauma, or education

You may find that much of what you call your "truth" is inherited or reactive—not chosen.






