- **Phase I:** Online Screening Test (Objective Type)
- **Phase II:** Online Descriptive Test
- **Phase III:** Interview

Phase I - Online Screening Test Syllabus

Introduction

"The Phase I of the RBI Grade B exam is an objective type online screening test. The exam is designed to assess the candidate's knowledge in four primary areas. Candidates must be well-prepared in each section to qualify for Phase II of the examination."

Syllabus Breakdown

The Phase I syllabus is divided into **four sections**:

1. **General Awareness (GA)**
 2. **English Language**
 3. **Quantitative Aptitude**
 4. **Reasoning Ability**
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1. General Awareness (GA)

This section evaluates the candidate's knowledge of current events, banking and financial sectors, as well as general knowledge. It contains questions related to the following topics:

- **Current Affairs**
 - National and International news (last 6 months)
 - Sports events, awards, and recognitions
 - Summits, conferences, and agreements
- **Economic and Financial Awareness**
 - Economic policies of the Government of India
 - Key economic terms and their definitions (Inflation, Recession, etc.)
 - Budget and Finance-related concepts
 - Monetary and Fiscal policies

- **Banking Awareness**
 - Structure of the Indian banking system (Public, Private, Foreign Banks)
 - Reserve Bank of India (RBI) policies, functions, and roles
 - Financial regulations, banking terms (e.g., NPA, CRR, SLR, etc.)
 - Key banking initiatives and schemes (PMGDISHA, Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana, etc.)
 - **Other Important Topics**
 - Government Schemes (e.g., Jan Dhan Yojana, Mudra Yojana)
 - Financial markets and instruments (Bonds, Shares, Mutual Funds, etc.)
 - International Organizations (IMF, World Bank, WTO, etc.)
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2. English Language

This section tests the candidate's proficiency in the English language. Topics include:

 - Passage-based questions with detailed understanding and inference
 - Main idea and theme of the passage, vocabulary, and tone
 - **Vocabulary**
 - Synonyms and antonyms
 - Phrasal verbs and idioms
 - **Sentence Correction**

 - Correcting sentence structure and usage
 - **Fill in the Blanks**
 - Vocabulary-based fill-in-the-blank questions
 - Cloze tests involving contextual word choices
 - **Sentence Rearrangement**
 - Rearranging jumbled sentences to form a coherent paragraph
 - **Error Spotting**
 - Spotting errors in subject-verb agreement, tense, etc.
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3. Quantitative Aptitude

This section measures the candidate's ability to analyze numerical data and solve quantitative problems. Topics covered are:

- **Number System**
 - Integers, fractions, decimals
 - LCM, HCF
 - Square roots and cube roots
- **Data Interpretation**
 - Bar charts, pie charts, tables, and line graphs
 - Solving problems based on interpretation of data

- **Time & Work**
 - Work efficiency and time calculations
 - Problems involving workforce, time, and job completion
 - **Profit and Loss**
 - Calculating profit, loss, percentage profit/loss
 - Discount and markup calculations
 - **Averages**
 - Mean, median, mode
 - Weighted averages
 - **Simple and Compound Interest**
 - Calculation of interest, principal, and time
 - Problems on compound interest
 - **Speed, Distance, and Time**
 - Relative speed
 - Time, speed, and distance problems
 - **Percentages**
 - Percentage increase and decrease
 - Profit margin, percentage comparisons
 - **Ratio and Proportion**
 - Ratio comparisons
 - Solving problems involving mixtures and partnerships
 - **Mensuration**
 - Area, perimeter, and volume of various geometrical shapes (circle, square, rectangle, etc.)

 - Problems on probability of events
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4. Reasoning Ability


The Reasoning section tests your ability to think logically and solve problems using your analytical skills. Key topics include:

- **Puzzles and Seating Arrangement**
 - Linear and circular arrangements
 - Scheduling and number puzzles
- **Syllogism**
 - Statements and conclusions
 - Venn diagrams and logical deductions
- **Blood Relations**
 - Relationship-based reasoning
 - Understanding family relationships
- **Direction Sense**
 - Problems related to directions and distances
 - Identifying correct/incorrect paths based on given directions


- **Coding and Decoding**
 - Letter-number coding systems
 - Finding patterns in coded words
 - **Analytical Reasoning**
 - Series completion (number series, letter series)
 - Odd one out, analogy, and classification problems
 - **Logical Sequence and Number Series**
 - Identifying and solving sequences based on logic
 - **Ranking and Time Sequence**
 - Ranking of individuals in a line, selection of individuals based on certain criteria
 - **Data Sufficiency**
 - Determining whether the given data is enough to answer the question



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Phase II - Online Objective + Descriptive Test Syllabus

Introduction

"Phase II of the RBI Grade B exam consists of both objective-type and descriptive-type papers. The Phase II exam is more comprehensive and tests candidates' in-depth knowledge of Economics, Finance, and Management, as well as English language skills. Candidates must qualify in both the objective and descriptive sections to move to the final interview round."

Syllabus Breakdown

The **Phase II syllabus** is divided into **three sections**:

1. **Economic and Social Issues (ESI)** – Objective & Descriptive
 2. **Finance and Management (FM)** – Objective & Descriptive
 3. **English Writing Skills** – Descriptive
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1. Economic and Social Issues (ESI)

Objective Section:

This section assesses a candidate's understanding of economic concepts, policies, and social issues. Topics include:

- **Economic Reforms in India**
 - Economic reforms since 1991, including LPG (Liberalization, Privatization, Globalization)
 - Role of RBI, SEBI, and other financial institutions in economic reforms
- **Economic Growth and Development**
 - Economic growth vs. development
 - Sustainable and inclusive growth
 - Regional disparities in economic development
- **Indian Economy and Agriculture**
 - Agriculture sector's contribution to the Indian economy
 - Issues related to agriculture, rural development, and agrarian distress
